Year 9 Options – Ms Allaway

Year 9 students had their kick-start assembly for Options on Monday this week. All tutors should have by now held short conversations with their tutees as an introduction to thinking about Options and I do hope that you have been having those conversations at home too! Next week there are two important events for students and parents:

- 1. **The Options Fayre, Tuesday 31st January, 5-7pm in North Wing.** Please note from the attached Options Timeline that this year we will be holding *two* talks on Options during the evening and this has been split into colleges. Train to Teach Opportunity – Mr Ward (Responsible for Student Teacher Training)

I am writing to inform you about current opportunities at Fortismere for would-be teachers. Fortismere is part of an alliance of National Teaching Schools called the New River Teaching Alliance (NRTA). One of the NRTA's key priorities is the recruitment and training of new teachers. Our teacher training is delivered through a Government funded scheme known as School Direct. In summary, our School Direct Scheme is a full school-based, school-led teacher training course run in partnership with the University of London's Institute of Education.

The programme has been designed to give those who wish to enter the teaching profession hands-on experience at Fortismere and other Haringey schools. Successful completion of our School Direct programme leads to the award of a Postgraduate Certificate of Education (PGCE), the recognised qualification for teachers in the United Kingdom.

It is for this reason that I am writing to you. You, or someone you know, may be interested in considering teaching as a possible career either as a first choice or as a change of career.

We have a limited number of places available in September for those would like to train as secondary school teachers. In order to be eligible all applicants must:

- have a degree level qualification in the subject or a closely related subject
- have Maths and English GCSEs at grade C level or above
- have spent a minimum of five days' work experience in a school prior to interview. NB this is something we may facilitate for those who meet the first two criteria.

We have an excellent record of training and securing employment for teachers across our alliance of schools. If you meet the criteria above, are interested in joining our School Direct Scheme and would like to learn more about this, please do not hesitate to contact Iraj Felfeli who coordinates the programme from Alexandra Park School to arrange an initial informal discussion about the course. All students must line up at the end of break in their teaching groups, with their teacher to be registered. They will walk sensibly to the Synagogue in their teaching group with their teacher. The schedule will be as follows:

10.25 – 10.35am – students arrive and are settled. Students in the Y bank will sit downstairs with 9X3 and 9X5. This is a visit to a place of worship in the local community and all students are representing the school. BFL will be used if necessary. Brief welcome from Rabbi David to the synagogue itself followed by a brief talk from Ruth Jampel contextualising Bernard's story within the Holocaust by going over key facts and events.

11.00-12.10pm - Bernard will give his talk followed by a minute's pause to digest his story. This will be followed by a question and answer session from the students. There will be a summary of the event followed by the presentation of a thank you gift to Bernard.

12.15 – 12.20pm - dismissal of students – students downstairs will be dismissed first; those students sitting upstairs will be dismissed last. Chance for students to come and ask further questions if they wish. Students return to school for lunch and then go to Periods 4 and 5 as usual. All teachers will escort and remain with their classes during the times that they would be teaching them.

Whilst in the Synagogue, students will not be able to use the toilets so they must make sure that they go to the toilet during break time.


Orchestra




Sporting Success – Mr Cox
