Message from Mrs Helen Glass, Headteacher

It has been a mixed week here at Fortismere. We received the very sad news that the owner of our local pub, the Clissold Arms, George Karageorgis has passed away. George and the Clissold team have been huge supporters of the school, and I know that this wonderful member of our local community will be hugely missed. Our condolences go to his friends and family.

We experienced a power outage on Wednesday which meant we lost heating, lighting, IT systems and telephones. Even the school bell didn't work! Staff and students coped remarkably well but we inevitably took the decision to close school early that day for health and safety reasons. Unfortunately, the situation was completely beyond our control and I appreciate your patience. In particular, I am sorry for the Year 13 students who were in the middle of their mock exams; they coped with the disruption admirably.

Mobile Phones: Acceptable Use Policy Review, December 2016 - Ms Judge, Deputy Head

We would like to feedback to parents and carers on the review of the mobile phone policy which was undertaken at the end of last term.

Firstly, thank you to all parents who took the time to share their views. Parents were mostly in favour of keeping the policy but made some very useful suggestions to us about developing it. We also surveyed our staff and students as part of the review. Staff were very positive about the new policy – recognising the significant impact they could see on the improvement of classroom behaviour and approaches to study since its introduction. Students were less positive and still, on the whole, would like to have continuous access to their phones. However, the survey did evidence that a significant number of students saw the benefits of not having their phones with them during the course of the school day, including socialising without the use of the mobile phone!

There were a number of comments about process which we have taken note of and, as a response, have made a few adjustments to the policy. Additionally the review highlighted the need for some further clarifications over process.

Developments to *Fortismere School Mobile Phones: Acceptable Use* Policy following its review in December 2016:

- We have adjusted the policy so that it accepts that mobile phones may be present in **bags** but must be switched off and not accessed at all times while students are on site. This does NOT mean that students can carry mobile phones or electronic devices in their pockets (points 3.1, 3.3 and 3.4 in the revised policy)
- Where students are persistently breaching the policy Fixed Term Exclusion may be considered as a sanction (point 7.5 in the revised policy)

Points of clarification for the administration of *Fortismere School Mobile Phones: Acceptable Use* Policy following its review in December 2016:

- After school clubs Mobile phones cannot be used and should not be seen on the site at any time in the day. This includes at clubs after school hours. Should a student wish to contact home after hours we would expect them to request permission to do this via the supervising teacher or member of staff. That member of staff will either allow them to gain access to a school phone for this purpose or make a phone call on their behalf (point 3.5 in the revised policy)
- Collecting phones following confiscation Should a phone be confiscated, if a parent is unable
 to collect at the allotted time, after a period of 48 hours parents may nominate another adult to come
 and collect the mobile phone on their behalf. For parents wishing to do this they would need to
 contact the school office (mentioned in the email they receive) who will ask them to identify who will
 collect the device, and provide a disclaimer to cover any issues that might occur with the device
 once it is handed over to that person. We will ask to see I.D. from anyone who is not a parent who
 has come to collect a device (point 7.2 in the revised policy)

Improving communication

We will shortly be publishing a revised timetable for after-school clubs including locations and timings of the sessions. Any parent who urgently needs to communicate with their child while they are in attendance at a club should contact the school office.

We are currently planning to create meeting points across the school site so that students can organise to meet up with friends at break and lunchtimes. We hope this helps students find their friends easily during social time as they raise this as a particular concern in the student survey.

Please find attached to today's Newsletter a summary of parental responses to our Mobile Phone Policy review which you may find interesting to read.

We would like to remind parents that should their son/daughter breach policy and their phone is then confiscated the resulting sanctions are clear to them. We expect our staff to follow procedure and if a student is found in breach of the policy they are wholly accountable for their actions.

Once again, we would like to thank our parents/carers for the overwhelming support they have given the school as we have implemented and reviewed this policy.
