On Monday 19th June the winner of the Carnegie Medal 2017 was announced. And our shadowing group celebrated in style. The library was closed, we ate party food, we talked books, we watched the awards ceremony live on the big screen and we congratulated ourselves on 227 well-written and perceptive reviews on our Carnegie site http://bit.ly/1Qp8ckW (227 reviews is almost a record – sorry, you were beaten by 250 reviews posted in 2015!) The marks of a successful Carnegie year? 1) When you are told, "I wouldn't have usually picked this book up, but I'm so pleased I had to read it – what else have you got by him/her?" 2) "Can we form our own reading group next year? Can we use the library?" Yes, of course you can!

Tuesday 20th June was World Refugee Day, and our ex-Patron of Reading, Sita Brahmachari, came in to work with some of our Year 7s. She talked about her latest book, *Tender Earth*, and drew some amazing and empathetic responses from our enraptured (if incredibly hot!) students on the theme of "We are far more united that what divides us". They lay on the floor and created some wondrous posters (see below); it was very moving to see how affected they have been by recent tragedies and events. My mum, dad, sister and me climbed Snowdon several times in my youth so it seems appropriate. My dad will be joining me for the final leg up Snowdon and on completion we'll raise a toast to my mum and scatter her ashes in a place she loved.
