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Message from Mrs Helen Glass, Headteacher

Welcome back to a new academic year at Fortismere! I hope you all had a good Summer. We are still celebrating the wonderful achievements of students who took exams last term: our best ever set of results! At GCSE, 90% of students got grades of A*-C (86% including English and Maths), and at A-Level, 92% got grades of C and above. This is really outstanding and I salute the students, their families and the Fortismere staff for doing so well.

It has been lovely to welcome our new students this year and it has been far busier with youngsters joining us not only in years 7 and 12 but in every other year group, particularly 8 and 9. I hope all of the newest members of the Fortismere community will settle in well and enjoy their time with us.

The launch of our new mobile phone policy (see below for more details) has gone exceptionally well and I want to thank you and your sons, daughters for your support. We have all noticed the difference it has made already and I have been delighted to hear the lively conversations going on around the site because students are once again talking to each other rather than being glued to their phones! We will be looking to provide more clubs and activities for students because time away from phones means more time to engage with one another in more constructive ways.

I look forward to meeting many of you at the various events that are part of the Autumn term. In the meantime, wishing you all a great weekend, and to our Muslim families, happy Eid Al Adha next week.

New Mobile Phone Policy – Ms Judge, Deputy Head

From September 2016 students in Years 7 – 11 are not permitted to bring mobile phones to school. We are convinced that mobile phones are a distraction and have serious concerns about the impact of their inappropriate use. We do know their use is reducing our students' ability to connect with one another socially on a day-today basis. We also believe that removing the distraction of mobile phones at school will impact favourably on our students' approaches to their studies and ultimately outcomes for all. The policy is in immediate effect from the start of term in September 2016. Any student in Years 7-11 seen in possession of a phone at school will have the device confiscated. We will also confiscate phones from students when it becomes evident that they have been using them to communicate during the school day. Any phone that is confiscated will be kept in a secure location in either North or South Wing office. Parents will be notified as soon as a phone has been confiscated. They will be invited to collect the phone from the relevant school office after a period of 24 hours has lapsed. We will not return phones directly to students. Please also note that the same rules will apply to tablets that are bought on the premises.

Please also be aware that our staff will rigorously and consistently enforce this policy from the start of term but that we do not intend to carry out routine bag searches on students. We understand that some parents will expect their sons and daughters to have phones accessible to them on their school journey but once the student is on site they will no longer be able to use the phone.

Parents and carers should be reassured that they will still be able to communicate with students during the course of the school day through our established communication pathways. Please contact the school switchboard and a member of our admin team will be able to pass on any urgent messages to students. Sixth Form students will be permitted to carry phones on site but should keep them away in their bags during lessons.

In order to support this cultural shift at Fortismere we have set an early review date for our Mobile Phone Acceptable use Policy. Its first review will be in September 2016. As part of this review we will be consulting parents, students and staff and ensuring that we consider a range of views in order to develop and refine the policy as appropriate. We do hope that members of our community will be able to consider its impact at that point and take the time to share their views then.

Based on our considerable experience of the distraction phones cause and the serious impact of their inappropriate use, we hope that you will see this as an opportunity to support your child in sensible and safe use of technology.

Latin Lessons at Fortismere – Mr Strathdene, Teacher of English and Head of Colosseum College

A reminder that Latin lessons are moving to an after-school slot, 3.30pm on Thursdays, starting next week on 15th September. If your child is interested in starting or continuing to learn Latin, they should come to Room S12 then. We have a team of volunteers from the UCL Classics Department led by Parent-Governor Pat Dugdale and should be able to cater for all levels from beginners to GCSE. We teach students of all ages, who relish the challenge and find it valuable support in their English and modern foreign language work. It is also popular with 6th formers, particularly classical civilisation students, and enhances their university applications. This summer, we entered 14 students for Latin exams, seven for GCSE or GCSE equivalent level 2 exams and 7 for intermediate level 1 exams. The results were excellent, with all students doing well and the majority achieving A* grades, a major achievement by students, some as young as year 9, who had had only one Latin lesson a fortnight as part of Fortismere's enrichment programme. We are delighted that we can now offer Latin lessons weekly in the new after-school slot on Thursdays.
