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Message from Mrs Helen Glass, Headteacher

This week, we hosted and co-delivered the first session of an exciting training course for senior leaders in schools. We are members of the New River Teaching Alliance which is a group of outstanding schools in Haringey, chosen by the Department for Education as Teaching Schools. Based on our excellent track record, we play a leading role in the training and professional development of school staff. Fortismere's strategic priority within the Alliance is Research and Development, and we will be delivering training to a cohort of aspiring senior leaders throughout the year. This provides a great opportunity to share best practice, to promote the excellent work of our school community and to ensure that we are at the cutting-edge of education provision.

I enjoyed delivering three College assemblies this week to update students on key focus points for the year ahead, and to celebrate our exam results and wider achievements.

I also gave my President's address to the Fortismere School Association (FSA). The FSA is a dedicated group of parents/carers who organise a fantastic range of events and activities for the school – all to raise much-needed funds for the little 'extras' that enhance student life. They have fun doing it too! At the moment, we have a core group of five parents/carers who do everything on the FSA, which I'm sure you will agree is a little unfair since the whole school community benefits. We would all appreciate it if more of you could spare some time to help; the more parents/carers that get involved, the more evenly the effort will be spread, the more events we can run and the more money will be raised for students. Non-Registration Texts - Ms Greenwood, Administrator responsible for ParentMail

Please be aware that PMX ParentMail does not currently have the facility to tell you which of your children we are texting you about for Non Registration at the start of the school day. We appreciate that this is frustrating and the ParentMail technical team are working on an update to ensure that this is possible, but that may take a while. In the meantime, there are two ways you can find out which child the message relates to:

- if you have downloaded the PMX App, your child's name will be in the subject heading of the message.
- you can log into PMX ParentMail, click into SMS and you will see the message history. Click on the message you are concerned about and it will say 'Message sent to... regarding...' the name of the specific child will be shown there.

If you are still unsure or concerned, please call us to determine which child it is that you are being texted about.

Thank you to everyone who came along to our AGM on Wednesday this week.

The new people who came along expressed their surprise that there are so few people involved in the running of the FSA given that the school is so big (Fortismere has around 1,500 families and the FSA just has around 10 parents who regularly come along and help plan and make the events happen) and they thought it was worth us reminding you all!

If you feel that you can help out, even if it's just to manage one aspect (eg booking the marquee), or an hour of admin time ordering the sparklers, please do get in touch with Kirsty at markskirsty@gmail.com. Please don't assume we have loads of volunteers already! There are just a few of us on the team and can be very stretched, particularly when we have big events like Fireworks Nigh to manage, so please volunteer to help plan things as well as on the day.

It has never been more important to help the school when funding is so tight. The school site is wonderful and large, but Mrs Glass has told us how much it costs to keep it running (eg draining the field last year cost around £125,000). The school doesn't receive more funds from the Borough because it's bigger and the infrastructure is always in need of updating. Last year FSA funding meant that, for example, the Science Labs could be updated with new microscopes (the previous ones were 12 years old) and the DT Lab could have more than one 3D Printer for all the kids to use.

We all want our kids to have the best learning environment possible and we all have a responsibility to help out and make that happen. So please do get involved.
