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#### Message from Mrs Helen Glass, Headteacher

#### Message from Ms Cara Williams, Chair of Resources Committee (Fortismere Governing Body)

I am writing to you again on the issue of funding for Fortismere School.

As many you will be aware the crisis in schools funding is continuing, and it is unclear what the General Election result may mean for the future. Our income is falling in real terms whilst we face increasing costs, particularly from National Insurance and pension contributions for teachers.

We are currently finalising the budget for next year, and it is clear that once more we face a shortfall of funds. We are making every attempt to save money in non-teaching and learning areas but this is becoming increasingly difficult.

We are very grateful to the many parents who have contributed generously to the school – your help has allowed us to buy resources for lessons, including Science and DT equipment as well as text books.

If you are able to increase your contribution or donate for the first time, it would be much appreciated by staff, students and governors and will help us to continue providing the excellent education at Fortismere that we all value.

Given the current terror threat, and in light of best practice, we are planning to drill our Lock-Down procedure towards the end of next week. It is not our intention to disrupt or worry students, but we are sure you will agree that it is important to be prepared and ensure that our school community is ready to respond should it ever be faced with such a scenario.

#### Chess Club - Mr Renner, Head of Business Studies & Economics


Chess Club resumes on 23<sup>rd</sup> June in Room 13T1. Everyone welcome.

We took a Year 9 class to Muswell Hill library on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> June to meet author Nicci Cloke. Nicci is the author of adult fiction, but she has also written two excellent (recommended) books for young adults called *Follow Me Back* and *Close Your Eyes*. We tend to find that Year 9s would rather do anything than participate in front of each other (far too cool for that!) but Nicci got them working on different scenarios that got them thinking about social media and its advantages/dangers. Some very perceptive ideas and comments ensued. This visit to our local library was the last of our YA Shot visits to Muswell Hill Library (<a href="http://yashot.co.uk/">http://yashot.co.uk/</a>); we'd like to thank the staff of the library for their generous welcome and lovely space. It has been great introducing (re-introducing) some of our students to this excellent local facility.
