# **Bids Evening Feedback**

Last night the FSA, parents/carers and teachers met to discuss the bids for the year. Thank you to all the teachers who took the time to give detailed presentations and answers to the questions that came up; Mr Strathdene, Ms Allaway, Ms Overs, Ms Fineberg, Ms Vangucci, Ms Brooks, Mr Corke, Ms Davey, Mr Egunjobi, Mr Rainey, Mr Yakup and Mr Liggett; apologies came from Mrs Ward and Dr Daniels. A special mention also to students Adam Ramgoolie and Billy Krish, Deputy KS4 leaders, for their presentation (**Student Voice)** and the Year 7 students Jennifer Mulligan, Nusayba Ali and Yu-Wei Huang, who missed some of the school's Halloween party to put forward a strong case for equipment for the new Year 7 common room.

This year we have had requests for just over £105k, this is a 50% increase on the amount requested last year, and we only have £55k! Below, an extract from Dr Daniels' (Head of Science) letter, explaining the need for more equipment better than we can explain ourselves:

"... Every item on the bid directly relates to equipment required for the practical assessments activities, which are compulsory under the new specifications. Pupils must have gained experience in a set of predetermined practical activities in order to complete the new 1-9 GCSEs which have been introduced this year and A-level courses which were introduced last year. Without this equipment pupils will be at a disadvantage as they will not have been able to experience for themselves the use of this equipment, instead they will have to see a demo or watch a video clip. The examinations now directly question this knowledge and the very best way for students to engage with the practical is to be able to physically carry them out themselves...."

All the relative documents have been uploaded <u>here</u> – please take the time and have a read; there are many great ideas/initiatives but sadly it also reflects the situation that most schools are finding themselves in at the moment, <u>and why your help is essential in helping with fundraising events and any projects the</u> FSA would like to organise for this year.
