They shared their favourite books with him, and he with them; *Watership Down* (Adams) and *The Earthsea Quartet* (le Guin) will be very popular loans from the library for the next few weeks! Our students now know that drafting and re-drafting is essential to create a prize winning novel, and all good writers are good readers. They discovered that *Phoenix* would not exist without the influence of the film Star Wars (before it became Part IV) and that it's necessary to persevere even when you've been rejected by publishers (80 times!) There wasn't enough time for SF to answer all the questions that the delightful audience wanted to ask so he encouraged them to go onto his website www.sfsaid.com and post questions there. With just over a week to go, we now start our next project – please donate your unwanted textiles! We have a collection area in South Wing car park: bring your textiles in plastic bags such as bin liners.

We accept all kinds of wearable adult and children's clothing, uniforms, hats, shoes, belts, handbags, and household textiles including sheets, pillow cases, duvet covers, curtains and towels.

We DO NOT accept: blankets, Bric-a-Brac, duvets, pillows, sleeping bags, soft toys, rugs, carpet, offcuts of fabric, any wet items, tent canvas, and no ripped or stained clothing. Unfortunately we are also unable to accept towels, bedding and curtains from commercial organizations. E.g. Hospitals, hotels and animal sanctuaries.

Last year we collected 880kg of textiles – let's do it again!
