Reminder: Non-Registration Texts – Ms Greenwood, Administrator responsible for ParentMail

Please be aware that PMX ParentMail does not currently have the facility to tell you which of your children we are texting you about for Non Registration at the start of the school day. We appreciate that this is frustrating and the ParentMail technical team are working on an update to ensure that this is possible, but that may take a while. In the meantime, there are two ways you can find out which child the message relates to:

- if you have downloaded the PMX App, your child's name will be in the subject heading of the message.

- you can log into PMX ParentMail, click into SMS and you will see the message history. Click on the message you are concerned about and it will say 'Message sent to... regarding...' – the name of the specific child will be shown there.

If you are still unsure or concerned, please call us to determine which child it is that you are being texted about.


