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Message from Mrs Helen Glass, Headteacher

This week, Year 7s had a special assembly about personal safety. Throughout their time at Fortismere, students will receive age-appropriate information about the dangers of social media, drugs, sexual health and other issues, to help keep them safe and prepare them for adulthood. We will keep you updated.

On a lighter note, we also celebrated the 100th anniversary of Roald Dahl's birth, with a wonderful party in the library for Year 7s. Thanks to all the staff who made this such an enjoyable event. Mobile Phone Policy Update - Ms Judge, Deputy Head

We are delighted with the support we have received for our new mobile phone policy. We would like to thank all parents and carers for their support of the policy, particularly those who have taken the time to call or email with positive feedback. Students have responded brilliantly to this initiative and seem to be seeing the benefits of having this distraction removed from them while they are in school. We would like to extend our thanks to staff, parents and students who have embraced this cultural shift.

We are keen that the management of this policy is effective as possible so certainly during the course of this term we will communicate regularly on how its implementation is going. This week we would like to set out a couple of points for clarification:

- 1. If a mobile phone is confiscated it may be collected on **the next school day** between the times of **3.30pm and 4.30pm** from the relevant school office. This information is stated clearly in the ParentMail that is sent home to parents and carers of students who have had their phones confiscated. A previous message which mentioned 24 hours later as the point at which phones can be picked up has caused some confusion so please observe this clarification above.
- 2. We have had some concerns raised about safety of students if they are leaving school having had their phones confiscated. We would like to add that the school cannot be held responsible for the safety of students as they travel to and from school. Some concerns have been expressed about

safe travel to and from school. We would hold the position that students should always use safe and known routes if they are travelling independently home from school. We also know that mobile phones do not necessarily provide safety – in fact visibly using a mobile in public can, at times, make a young person more vulnerable to theft. If you believe that your son or daughter needs a phone in their bag because they have to travel somewhere after school we would ask that you make it clear to them that it must not be seen on school premises. It is their responsibility to ensure that they do not contravene the policy. We would like to clarify that the school will not release confiscated phones before the following day at the designated times following any complaint made about travel issues.

Review – Finally, we would like to clarify that the official policy review is recorded as **December 2016.** However, in order to engage in as much dialogue as possible with our community about the impact of the ban on mobile phones we will be inviting initial comments from staff, students and parents at the end of September. Thank you to those who have already written and expressed their views by email. We have collated these and they are being used to inform ongoing discussion about how we can ensure this initiative has a positive and lasting impact.

Early Closure Wednesday 21st September: Open Afternoon – Mr Ward, Assistant Head

A reminder that the school will close at 12:25pm on Wednesday and students will be dismissed home at that time. This is to allow Prospective Parents and Carers to attend our Open Afternoon. Please note that the Canteens will not be serving food at lunchtime. Students receiving free school meals can collect their lunches during break time.

Year 8 students will be acting as guides for the visitors that afternoon. They should report to North Wing Hall at 1pm.

Year 10 Option Changes - Ms Allaway, Assistant Head

I shall be working with Ms Ogilby next week on the options changes that some Year 10s have requested. Please be aware these changes will take place from the following week. There will be just a small window of opportunity for students to make changes and of course the decisions will rely on a number of factors; it is not as easy as just agreeing for students to move carte blanche, as I am sure you will acknowledge. Factors taken into account are:

- if the move is possible a change may involve moving more than one class
- numbers of students in other classes
- teacher / student ratio
- whether the student had originally placed the option down in their six preferences as these will then take priority
- reasons for changing.

I'm pleased to be able to offer a leadership opportunity for 6th form students supporting a karate extracurricular activity that is going to run on Thursdays as of 29th September, 3.30-4.30pm.

The students will be asked to write a half-hour play on an issue they are interested in and, if chosen, the pay will be performed at the national Theatre in July.
