Payments on ParentMail - Finance Department

We often receive queries from parents/carers about where to find items such as school trips or Fortismere events which are available and due for payment on their ParentMail account. Hopefully the information below will provide a useful guide to any parent/carer new to ParentMail or simply as a general reminder to others.

PMX ParentMail Online Payments - How do I buy an item from school?

You will be able to see Payments as an option in your parent feed on either your computer or through the ParentMail App. If you have a notification, it means your school have invited you to pay for something, or have notified you of a new payment item which is now available for you to buy or pre-order.

From my computer: Please see the screenshot shown below:




Once in Payments, you will be able to view items "To Pay" or visit the "**Shop**" which can be found in the top right hand corner of your screen.

Once you have found an item you want to purchase, simply click on it, and go through any options – such as quantity, size, colour etc. You can then choose to 'Add to Basket' and continue shopping, or click 'Pay Now' to checkout straight away.

Their knowledge of *Oliver Twist* led to some really perceptive questions and answers about Steve's book *Nobody Saw No One* (which is based on the Dickens story) and the subject matter of *Blood Donors* – bloodsucking bugs - left them wanting more. They all loved the games Steve used to get them moving, especially the Obedience Game, and goodness knows what the voters in the polling station on the floor below thought when we all joined in with Steve's poem without words (but with much clapping, clicking and stamping of feet). The sign of a good author visit is that the Year 7s wanted to carry on and not leave the library, even though it was home time!
