From the Library

On Monday 26th June we were delighted to welcome author Sarah Matthias to the library. Sarah's books have been about medieval history, but *A Berlin Love Song* is set against the backdrop of World War II. Our Year 9 historians are currently studying the Holocaust, so Sarah spoke to three classes (and a Year 8 class who happened to be in the library!) about the extensive research she did, especially into what Angela Merkel has called the Forgotten Holocaust – the wartime persecution of the Romani people. Although her book is a work of fiction, our Year 9s discovered that there are different ways to immerse yourself into an



historical period – and reading well-researched stories is one of them. A fascinating and moving afternoon; we all learned a lot.

I have been following – and bidding on – an online auction called "Authors for Grenfell". The site has now closed, raising over £150,000 and I'm pleased to say that I have secured two wonderful authors for future Fortismere visits. Watch this space for details...

Anything by Anthony McGowan! *Henry Tumour* is black humour told from the point of view of a brain tumour. *The Knife that Killed Me* is as dark as the title and has been made into an excellent film. Anthony also writes short, edgy books for the student who wants a simpler read but with more age-suitable content. And of course his latest book, *Everybody Hurts* (co-written with Joanna Nadin and which we will be reviewing for the TES – volunteers needed!) Raising Money for Sarcoma UK: 3 Peaks Challenge – Mr Carter, Head of Rhodes

I'm supporting Sarcoma UK, the only cancer charity in the UK focused on all types of sarcoma. Sarcoma is a cancer of the bone and soft tissue. I lost my mum to this disease last year, which has had a huge impact on me and my family. I am aiming to complete the national Three Peaks challenge on 7-8th July, climbing Ben Nevis, Scafell Pike and Snowdon (the three highest mountains in each of Scotland, England and Wales respectively), hopefully in 24 hours.

My mum, dad, sister and me climbed Snowdon several times in my youth so it seems appropriate. My dad will be joining me for the final leg up Snowdon and on completion we'll raise a toast to my mum and scatter her ashes in a place she loved.
