# Wellbeing: Year 10 RAP (Raising Awareness and Prevention Project) – Mrs Prinsley, PSHE Co-ordinator

As part of the Year 10 Wellbeing and RS programme students will be watching the RAP presentation in their Wellbeing lessons on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> March (Y Bank Y Period 1; X Bank Period 5).

RAP workshops have been carefully designed to equip teenage girls and boys between the ages of 13-18 with the tools to avoid becoming a victim of rape and sexual assault. These presentations are not about physical self-defence, sex and relationship education nor about intimidating teenagers but are about empowering them with the common sense skills to be able take care of themselves and each other.

The RAP Project focuses on real life cases, laws, statistics and guidelines. Consent, online pornography and social media are also addressed. There will also be a presentation in June for all parents/carers by the RAP presenters, Deana Puccio and Allison Davey.

#### **Health Clinics**

Ongoing support is also be available – Michelle Cohen, the NHS nurse allocated to Fortismere, provides a student drop-in service on Tuesday mornings between 8am and 10am. Students of all ages are welcome to come along and topics covered will include the impact of smoking and alcohol on health, nutrition, puberty, positive sleep patterns and the impact of social media on learning.
