We listened to the testimony of Holocaust survivor, Bernd Koschland who, at the age of 8, travelled from Nuremberg whilst it was under Nazi persecution of the Jews on the Kinder Transport. He arrived in the UK in 1939 and his sister followed him a few months later. His story was one of triumph in a time of terror and his message to our students was that individual acts that show solidarity with others can make the world a better place.
