Year 7 and 8 Group Changes – Senior Leadership Team

We would like to inform you that after careful consideration and consultation with our Pastoral Heads we have decided to change the groupings of Year 7 and 8 this year, with new groupings to start in September. This is for two reasons:

- The Year 7 Mandarin Excellence Programme will be run solely in X bank next year in Year 8. Therefore students who follow this programme in Y bank need to move over to X bank. This would mean that we would have to pick students to move into Y fairly.
- In-Year admissions this academic year to both year groups has meant that classes have become unbalanced in their makeup and this has impacted on progression of learning in some cases.

Please be assured that at the very core of our decision to change Year 7 and 8 we have the wellbeing and education of *all* of our students. Our students are already taught in a variety of combinations, for example, in Maths, DT and VT so the number of teaching classes affected is relatively small. At Fortismere we subscribe, as far as possible, to mixed ability teaching and creating young people who are confident and self-assured. We are confident that the changes we are making will impact on the year groups positively. Lessons are for learning and students still have breaks and lunchtime to meet up with friends. The aim is the continuation of highly effective teaching to engaged and enthusiastic learners. Your support in the maintenance of high standards is appreciated

S F Said's Day in the Library

On Thursday 29th June Fortismere's Patron of Reading, S F Said, spent the afternoon and evening with us. He had lunch with some of Ms Massey's creative writing group. These lovely students have been working with Ms Massey in the library every Wednesday after school and have produced some phenomenally imaginative work which they then illustrated and which we have now made into a book to be on display in the library for posterity! SF then spent an hour working with one of our Year 9 classes on flash fiction. He explained that the three things which most good stories need are characters, setting and plot. He suggested ways to create these and then gave the students five minutes to write, without stopping, their first drafts. He gave them a break, talked about his own writing and then got them to think about ways to improve their stories. Five minutes re-drafting produced some superb flash fiction.



Period 5 was spent with our Carnegie Shadowers. Last year SF judged the Carnegie Amnesty Prize and enjoyed it so much that he read the shortlist this year specifically to be able to discuss the books with our Shadowers. This was an incredible session. Our students had so much to say and all views differed (although I still dispute the suggestion that *Railhead* is a "train wreck of a book"!) This is the essence of the Carnegie book group – students reading novels they wouldn't usually pick off the shelves and then forming their own passionate opinions of them. And not being afraid to voice them!



Our Reading Champions evening was glorious. Since March, our Year 7 students have been reading books from a list originally created by S F Said, English teachers and the librarians. They had to present the book they enjoyed the most to their English classes and each class then chose their favourite. On Thursday evening, each book was championed in front of an invited audience of family and friends and the presenters were questioned by the Chairman, S F Said (just like the Baileys' Prize for Fiction or Man Booker...) We were stunned by the quality of the



presentations, the imagination that had gone into films and visuals and the maturity and confidence of our students. Winning by a very narrow margin was Luca Turner with *The Enemy* by Charlie Higson, but in our opinion, everyone was a winner. Big thanks to everyone who supported the event, to the whole of Year 7 who took this competition so seriously and to Ms Ackerley who was a tower of strength and IT skills on the night.

This was the last event for our current Patron of Reading. S F Said has been with us for two years and has produced a real buzz around reading which is one of the main points of the scheme. His humour, anecdotes and patience have inspired our younger students and the Reading Champions competition was his idea – it will live on as his legacy! He has enjoyed his time with us and we are delighted that he is already asking to return to work with next year's Carnegie Shadowers and to attend our Reading Champions are now under way for our next PoR – watch this space!
