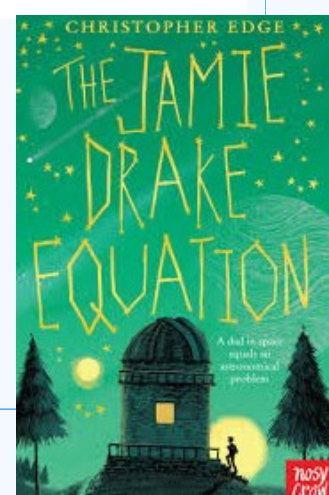
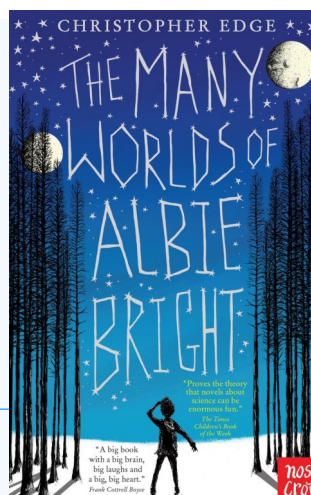

Alumni News

Lives Transformed Through Education



My name is Joe Winters, and I joined Fortismere in September 2006, eventually taking my A Levels in 2013.

I chose to study English Literature, History, French and Government & Politics as well as a Pre-U qualification in Global Perspectives and Research (which was like an academic version of the Extended Project). I decided to carry all five subjects into Year 13, and achieved A*s in French and Politics, and As in English and History. I got a Distinction in GPR (which

was the equivalent of an A*).

After Fortismere I went on to study English at Cambridge University, with a full choral scholarship. In my first and second years I also took the French degree simultaneously, and in 2014 I spent the summer living and studying at the Sorbonne in Paris. In 2016 graduated with a Double First Class degree in English, as well as winning the University Prize for English in my year. Cambridge offered amazing opportunities outside of the classroom, which I loved. I sang in choirs and played in orchestras; I

wrote articles for the University newspaper and plays for the student theatre.

I got particularly involved in student comedy and in 2015 I wrote for and produced the Footlights International Tour Show, which took a sketch-show around the UK, the Edinburgh Fringe, Europe and the US for four months.

I've just got back from the Edinburgh Fringe, where I co-wrote

and directed three shows this year, one of which won best joke of the Fringe*, and another of which has just been picked up for a series on Radio 4. For the rest of the year since I graduated I've worked a lot in theatre, most recently as the Assistant Director of the Pulitzer Prize finalist play, GLORIA, at the Hampstead Theatre. I'm just about to start rehearsals as the Assistant Director on the Royal Shakespeare Company's new production of The

Duchess of Malfi.

I learned how to love my work at Fortismere, as well as a commitment to working in the Arts as a possible and worthwhile career. Since leaving the school I've often been back to talk to students and teachers, and to maintain a link with the community that nurtured me to where I am now. I doubt I'd have made it into Cambridge or into Footlights, or into my current job if I hadn't started out with

such a solid foundation from Fortismere.
