
Our highlights of the term

for it' which came out just before the album has already had over 132 million views on Youtube. The song and video are quite confusing and the main idea seems to be the battle between


Taylor's reputation and her new self. In the video Taylor is seen rapping (or trying to), stuck in a box naked, and having her face blasted off – you make of it what you will.
