- 5 is the pass grade


Attainment 8 score which is an accumulation of your BEST 8 GCSE results, but not just any 8.....



### **The Attainment 8 Buckets**




#### **Bucket 1**





# The English Baccalaureate (EBacc)

- English Language
- English Literature
- Mathematics
- Sciences (2 of Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science)
- History or Geography
- A language can be a home language



You need to Choose 6 Options in order of priority. You will be given 4. We try to give you your top 4.



9<sup>th</sup> subject not counted as all buckets filled in and the best 8 grades used.

Attainment 8 score = 
$$(7+7) + (8+8) + 6 + 7 + 6 + 6 + 5 + 5 = 65$$

Dividing the Attainment 8 score by 10 gives a pupil's average grade. In this case it is **6.5** 



**Attainment 8 score =** (4 + 4) + (5 + 0) + 5 + 0 + 0 + 6 + 5 + 5 = 34Divide by 10 and Student B has an attainment 8 score of **3.4** 

The BEST 8 GCSE grades are used to fill in the buckets according to the rules given.

English Literature not taken so that English is not doubled. Only one Ebacc subject taken, so scores zero in two of the three Ebacc buckets. Only three of the four vocational subjects count.



## PROGRESS 8

- New School Accountability Measure
- Same 8 subjects as Attainment 8
- Measures Progress from KS2
- A Progress 8 score of '0' means that a student has made the Expected Progress from KS2
- Negative Progress 8 means they are making below Expected Progress
- Positive progress 8 means they are making above Expected progress
- School Target is + 0.3
- -0.5 and below 'EXPECT a VISIT'
