Fortismind - Supporting Mental Health at Fortismere

Managing Stress & Anxiety

Stress and anxiety are common feelings and it's important to be able to recognise them and know where to get support when you need it. <u>The Mental Health Foundation</u> has useful information and resources. Erisa Jolla, one of our Sixth Form Mental Health Leaders, has written for us this week on the topic of managing stress and anxiety: Stressful situations come in all shapes and forms, whether you are having a hard time revising for a test, have an upcoming deadline that is stressing you out, or even have had a recent argument with someone. A recent student well-being study found that 71% of students feel anxious about their classes and coursework and less than half feel comfortable asking questions. The research also found that more than half of students also struggle to practise healthy habits, and 64% have difficulty sleeping. *So how can we recognise stress and anxiety symptoms?*

Stress can manifest in various ways, including physical symptoms like headaches, cognitive issues like poor concentration, emotional symptoms like crying, irritability, and edginess, and negative behaviours like overeating or smoking, according to Dr. Webster from Harvard University.

How can we manage stress/anxiety?

To manage stress and anxiety, it's crucial to understand your triggers and then change your reactions to them. Relaxation techniques, such as meditation, yoga, and deep breathing exercises, can help lower your blood pressure, heart rate, breathing rate, and stress hormones.

Setting goals, for your work, relationships, creativity, play, and health, can also help create a positive sense of commitment, control, and optimism. By understanding and managing your triggers, you can better cope with stress and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Many of you may not be aware that Fortismere has its very own beehive and this year we're thrilled to announce that our students and the bees have successfully produced some honey! **Our very special Fortismere Honey will only be available to buy at the Winter Fair this Sunday** and in very limited quantities so make sure you get there early before stocks run out.

Our honey is the result of the hard work of some former Fortismere students, Patrik Chema and Matthew Price who have dedicated their time and effort to maintaining the bee colony. Plus a group of current students who have contributed to and been involved in the beekeeping process, Sabri Yakup Y10, deserves a special mention for his hard work and enthusiasm this year. Our bee colony is situated in Vik Sharma's Memorial Garden and we utilise the National hive method, which is based on Langstroth hive design principles.



Patrik has introduced an alternative Flow Hive, a new beehive invention that streamlines the process of collecting honey with a novel spigot system that taps into specially designed honeycomb frames. We hope to have some more honey for you next year and will keep you updated on news from the hive.
