School Leadership Messages

Dress Code

We would like to remind parents and carers that although we do not have a uniform we do have a Dress Code. This code is on posters around school and is shared with all parents when joining Fortismere. School is a place of work and the work is learning. Given this, we expect students to dress appropriately for the work of learning rather than how they would dress when not in school. Students will receive behaviour points and, where necessary, will be given T-shirts or trousers to wear for the duration of the school day. As the weather gets warmer, we would also like to emphasise the health risks of students' exposure to strong sunlight; covering up is far safer than exposing skin to UV light.

Phones

A reminder that all smartphones (and smart watches) are banned from Fortismere. This policy has been in place for many years and all parents and students are made aware of this when joining Fortismere. We do expect parents to work with us in supporting this policy. We will continue to conduct random searches and confiscate phones for a minimum of a week. Our only exceptions to this policy are on medical grounds and those students are closely monitored.

Water

As the weather gets warmer please could we ask that students bring water to school, preferably in a refillable water bottle. Students will have opportunities during the school day to refill their bottles from the drinking fountains but will not be permitted to leave their lessons for water. Students should also not leave it until the end of break or lunch to fill up their bottles as this will make them late to their next lesson/ tutor time.

Now that Y11 are on exam leave, we have time to work with our year groups as they begin their preparations for next year. Y9 will be moving in the North Wing from half term to give them the opportunity to begin the transition from the South WIng to the North Wing in support of moving from KS3 to KS4.
