Mr Higgins and Ms Temple from the History Department gave an excellent presentation on the aspects of LGBTQ+ history, from an overview of the local history in Haringey to the work in the curriculum, including cross-dressing pirates! The event included music, a range of external speakers and examples of

students' work produced during the month. In addition to the staff, students and parents/carers present, we had other staff from Haringey present making this a truly community event. We look forward to this being a regular feature of our school year.



Last Friday saw the A level Art and Photography show. We are in many ways

still emerging from the impact of Covid and the return of the GCSE and A level shows are indications of our return to a normal way of doing things. It was the first A level show in 2 years and it was fantastic to see all the talent from the department back on display. The work was, as always, outstanding. Lift Off in the National Water Rocket Challenge

Tuesday 21 June was not only the summer solstice and the start of astronomical summer, it was also launch day in the National Water Rocket Competition and Fortismere had two teams - Creighton and Tetherdown - taking part at the National Physical Laboratory in Teddington. Packing for the trip took a while as students needed rockets, launchpads, pumps, measuring jugs, lunch, sun cream, hats, umbrellas, camping chairs, trolleys, tools and spare equipment, should anything break! The competition consisted of three rounds and points were based on two components, rocket time in the air plus points for landing in a zone. The middle Zone B (65m - 70m) carried the most bonus points compared to Zone A (50m – 65m) and Zone C (75m – 90m). Things were going well and after round two, Team Creighton was in second place. Unfortunately in the third round our rockets veered off course Both our teams competed extremely well



and by the end of the three rounds our best placing was 5th – pretty good out of 50 teams. Above all the students enjoyed a great experience on a very sunny day and were all extremely well behaved and worked together superbly!

This month the students finished their Latin GCSE exams and we have high hopes of excellent results.
