We've seen lots of our parents in school this week at both the Year 9 Subject teachers' Evening on Wednesday and the Year 10 Parental Engagement event which was held last night in South Wing Hall. We were delighted with the turnout as it meant we are able to spend time with parents discussing how they can best support their sons and daughters as they commence their GCSE studies at Fortismere. The breadth and challenge at Key Stage 4 can feel daunting to many of our learners so it's extremely important that parents are aware how they can support approaching preparation for Year 11 not just in terms of academic readiness but also with an eye on issues related to wellbeing. We'd like to thank our Heads of College, two of our Directors of Learning Ms Jackson and Mr Strathdene and our Parental Engagement Officer Ms Harris-O'Hanlon for organising and leading the event.

However, there's still lots more to come in the shape of community events and we'd like to sign off this week by reminding parents and carers that our marvellous Christmas Fair is taking place in South Wing Hall this Sunday. It's always a wonderful event and an important fundraiser for the school.
