
Late Start: Monday 16th October

Without an example email address in your inbox:

- 1. Se<u>lect</u> Actions from the toolbar at the top of the screen.
- 2. Select Junk E mail.
- 3. Select Junk Email Options.
- 4. Click the Safe Sender tab.
- 5. Click Add.
- Type in the email address you wish to add to your safe sender list.
- 7. Click OK
