
It's the time of year when you may receive more post than usual, so please send any used postage stamps to the library. We will then forward them to the Hearing Dogs for Deaf People charity.

Asking For It and Cowgirl

One of the wonders of fiction is that it helps you to empathise, to "walk in someone else's shoes". And you may find someone who is experiencing the same problems as you. To mark the end of National Anti-Bullying Week, I'd like to recommend a couple of our books which look at bullying in very different ways. Asking For It by Louise O'Neill is one of the very few books that we restrict to Year 10s and above. The content makes it a hard and often distressing read. But its message is vitally important for boys and girls. For our younger readers I'd recommend Cowgirl by G R Gemin in which the eponymous heroine is different to her peers and treated badly as a consequence. **Gill Ward**

October Revolution centenary

A-level History students were invited by the History Department to attend a centenary event to commemorate the anniversary of the October Revolution in Russia, which took place on 7-8th November 1917 and catapulted the Bolsheviks into power. Year 12 and 13 History students enjoyed refreshments while studying Bolshevik propaganda posters, then listened to Mr. Stewart read Tsar Nicholas II's formal abdication, Ms. Sullivan read an excerpt from Lenin's April Thesis, and Ms. Common outline an overview of how the October Revolution served to shape major 20th century events.
