The event was held at the Zorlu Performing Arts Centre where 17 EDR teams were competing alongside 37 Vex IQ teams. The atmosphere throughout the day was inspiring! The event was without doubt the best hosted event the team had ever been to, including a mic controller, music, a huge LED display on stage, a superb field set up and the food and drink for staff and competitors was provided free throughout the whole day.


