This week we were delighted to learn that our Year 12 team of aspiring Economists won the IEA Budget Challenge final yesterday. This Competition, first introduced in 2018, is designed to replace the Bank of England Target 2.0 Competition. Fortismere's team, consisting of Dan Poirier, Barnaby Thomson and Frederick Hudson beating 11 other school team in the final event, coming from schools such as The North London Collegiate School, UCS Hampstead, Repton and Harrow. It is a fantastic achievement!! As part of the process the students had to put together a submission that outlined a budget with taxation and spending policy for the United Kingdom in the coming financial year, as well as more briefly analysing the macroeconomic conditions and setting out a broad policy and strategy in response to these. We'd like to thank Mr Renner his role in preparing the team and supporting the team on their road to Victory.

Mr Kenny's and Ms Holder's group of environmentalists have also been incredibly active in the past few weeks (see our last newsletter message) and we have been truly impressed by the passion displayed by the students who have become involved in the workshops that have been taking place. To support the work of this group of students we have agreed that we will organise for some of them to join the 2<sup>nd</sup> climate change march on 15<sup>th</sup> March with supervising staff. Mr Kenny's climate change group are meeting again on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> March and at that meeting students who have shown the most commitment to in-school environmental activities will be selected to represent Fortismere School at that event. We expect all other students to attend school, particularly since there is a delegation representing the views of the Fortismere community at this event.

On a similar note, our college ambassadors represented us positively in the community on Wednesday when they attend the WE day at Wembley Arena. A-list celebrities including The Duke and Duchess of Sussex (Prince Harry and Meghan Markle), Liam Payne, Nicole Scherzinger and Naomi Campbell, inspiring speakers and world leaders, mixed with real people and celebrated a year of action that transformed communities and changed lives.

Finally, we'd like to sign off by wishing you all Happy International Women's day. This will be followed by Fortismere's very own brilliant annual event to mark the occasion which is taking place on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> March in North Wing. Do get tickets if you haven't done so already. It is always an inspirational experience and this year marks the final event that will be organised by our Deputy Head Girl and one of the founding organisers of the event, Kezhe Julian-Temir (who you will remember won the Haringey Community Award for this very event). matches teams are ranked by their average score. Teams then form alliances in pairs to complete in the knock out stage. Fortismere had performed well throughout the season and qualified two EDand three Vex IQ teams. The standard this year was much higher than previous years, as the competition has grown in popularity across the country. Our two Vex EDR (Key stage 4 and 5) teams performed extremely well over the two days and reached the semi-final. Team 72477A Lord Flashheart were awarded the 'Service Award' and team 72477B also won the 'Sportmanship Award'. The Vex IQ teams made up mainly of Year 7s, performed incredibly well over the two days. In fact, going into the knock out stage Fortismere team 10640A had the UK high score of 35 and were seeded number 1 in the UK. The

students are an absolute asset to us; they behaved impeccably throughout their stay and time at the Vex UK National finals.

## **News from the Library**

A year 11 parent is currently working with Inclusive Minds <u>www.inclusiveminds.com</u> to help them grow their network of Inclusion Ambassadors. Inclusive Minds is a collective for people who are passionate about incluion, diversity, equality and accessibility in children's literature and are committed to changing the ace of children's books.

The Inclusion Ambassadors network is a team of young people (and some parents and youth workers) who share a real interest in seeing better representation in children's books. These are individuals (generally aged between 8 and 30) with important first-hand knowledge of particular facets of diversity and a genuine interest in sharing their expertise and experience.

Almost any young person or young adult can apply to become an Inclusion Ambassador. It's simply about sharing your own 'direct' knowledge with book creators to help them ensure they reflect all children's lives and experiences. It could be anything - gender, gender identity, family structure or size, age, religion, ethnicity, culture, race and heritage, socio-economic status, sexual orientation.....

Being an ambassador is a great chance to learn about the book world so it's brilliant if you are an aspiring writer or want to get into the industry. Depending on the nature of the project, sometimes there is a fee available for Ambassadors' input on books. If an Ambassador has worked with an author, they almost always receive a free book, get a credit in the acknowledgment and invitations to launches and events. There are also public speaking opportunities. One of the Ambassadors from Muswell Hill was recently invited to read a chapter of a Cressida Cowell book at the Imagine Festival at the Southbank Centre.








#### **Recommended Read of the Week**
