The year 12 Classics students had a great day out on Wednesday 6th February visiting the London Mithraeum, also known as the Temple of Mithras, and the Biritsh Museum. The Roman Mithraeum was discovered in Walbrook, a street in the City of London, during a building's construction in 1954. This is perhaps the most famous 20th-century Roman discovery in London and the entire site has recently been relocated to a permanent site next to Bank DLR station. We also paid a visit to the British Museum, to consolidate our knowledge of the Principate. Whilst there, we discovered that one of the students bears an uncanny resemblance to The Meroë Head of Augustus. Who would have thought it?



News from the Library


