Monday night saw the Haringey Outstanding for All Awards 2018 celebration at Alexandra Palace. It was a hugely enjoyable event with a sizeable Fortismere presence. As well as our nominees, Billie Krish in Year 12 co-hosted the awards and Alex Partridge in Year 11 performed as part of the Haringey Young Musicians Guitar Group. Both were excellent in their respective roles.

We were delighted that Kezhe Julian-Temir in Year 13 won the Community Hero Award. We had nominated her for the amazing work she has put into organising the two International Women's Days, now a key feature in the Fortismere calendar. In addition to involving other students in the events, Kezhe invited and co-ordinated staff presentations and external speakers. Both events have been inclusive, challenging of stereotypes and very well attended and supported by the local community. The competition for the award was fierce; Haringey is a borough with a strong tradition of inclusive action around diversity and equality and we are very proud of her. We are also very proud of Ms Arrowsmith, who we nominated for the Teacher of the Year award for her vision and hard work in creating and sustaining the Year 7 Camp. Ms Arrowsmith got down to the last three but sadly was pipped at the post. We still think that Ms Arrowsmith would have made a deserving winner and we are proud of our other nominees, including Ms Larsson and her excellent contributions to the Vik Sharma Memorial Garden and Ellie Gilbride in Year 8 for her significant sporting contributions.

Fortismere's presence in the community is not confined to Haringey awards. Jack Greaves in Year 10 has been playing the lead role of PT Barnum in Streetz Ahead's production of 'The Greatest Show on Earth' at the Arts Depot in North Finchley. We are delighted to see our students challenge themselves in so many creative and memorable ways.

Possibly less professional but definitely just as much fun is the upcoming Fortismere Panto. We took **part** *in the Tuesday afternoon rehearsal and were deeply impressed at the depth of talent on* display. Teaching's gain is definitely musical theatre's loss. If you would like to see the stunning performance of the Co-Heads, you will need to book tickets for the show.

The Christmas festivities are not confined to Panto: the organisation of the Fortismere Christmas Fair is more or less complete and we would urge you to both attend the Fair (there will be over 40 stalls, most of which represent local business that we would wish to support) and bid in the Silent Auction. Selling hampers at the Christmas Fair raised a whole heap of money last year and we would like to do the same this year. Can you help? Please donate any Christmassy food items we can include such as



News from the Library

On Tuesday 27th November we were delighted to welcome possibly the most inspirational visitor we've ever had to Fortismere library. Raymond Antrobus - "Poet, Educator, Editor, Curator, Investigator of Missing Sounds" - is a Blanche Nevile/Fortismere alumnus (1998-2003). He ran a workshop in the library for a Year 8 class together with our hearing impaired students, talking to them about his life as a deaf person, his love for Blanche Nevile (in his day, their football team used to hammer Fortismere!) and how he used to steal English exercise books for his writing. (He was overjoyed when Mrs Coles, who taught him English then, forgave him!) He showed the students how to create "Metaphor Machines" which will really help with their creative writing. During the next period, Raymond's performance and openness when answering students' questions in South Wing Hall had many of us in tears. He told of how he was embarrassed about signing in main stream school and when he started work, preferring to pretend he wasn't deaf and suffering the consequences.

His poetry was incredibly powerful and well-chosen and the teachers who attended were amazed to see 160 Year 8 students totally silent and engaged for the whole hour. They even sat through the lunchtime buzzer! We also invited students from Blanche Nevile to meet this incredible role model, and David Pacquette from BN signed the whole performance for them.

And if we weren't in enough pieces already, we then received an email from a Year 8: "...I am writing this email to inform you about a poem that I have made. I was inspired to write this poem because of the visitor we had yesterday in period 3..." attaching a glorious poem based on what he'd heard. As he was leaving, Raymond said, "I feel that Fortismere made me". Please take a look at his website www.raymondantrobus.com.









Recommended Reads of the Week

Sara Barnard's *A Quiet Kind of Thunder* is a YA novel about a girl who won't speak and a deaf boy – highly recommended. *El Deafo* by Cece Bell can be found in our graphic novel section. It's brilliant and sympathetic and funny. *The Silent Striker* by Pete Kalu tells the story of an incredible footballer whose professional career is potentially marred by his increasing deafness.
