Following our recent OFSTED inspection we are now pleased to be able to share the Inspectors' findings which can be read in their letter which is attached to this week's Newsletter but can also be viewed [here](#) on our website.

The inspectors came to conduct a Section 8 Inspection with a specific safeguarding focus. For such inspections the school could be found to be either 'effective' or 'not effective', there is no grading scale, and we are pleased to announce that we were judged to be 'effective'. We are also incredibly pleased that the inspectors recognised the high standards relating to safeguarding our students within the school and the effectiveness of our staff in supporting student wellbeing.



We are particularly delighted that the Inspectors also compliment our students on being 'confident and knowledgeable' but they also celebrate the notion that their voice is powerful within their school community which is something of which they should all be very proud.

At Fortismere we find so many opportunities to be proud of our students. We have been particularly impressed with those students who regularly take advantage of the opportunities to immerse themselves in reading provided by Ms Ward our Senior Librarian and members of our English department. We have had the pleasure of visiting the Year 7 Reading Award group and the Year 9 Book Group who meet on a weekly basis in the library to discuss their love of reading. It is fantastic to see the levels of engagement and passion these students have with their reading and really impressive to listen to their literary debates! Thanks must go to Ms Ward, Mrs Coles and Ms Adams for leading these sessions and we'd like to encourage all of our students to keep an eye on events and clubs run by the library as there really is so much on offer!

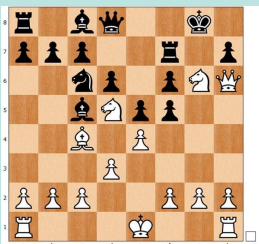

We are delighted to announce that Focus Football are introducing their Pre School Football Development Program to Years 7 to 11. More details in the attached letter.

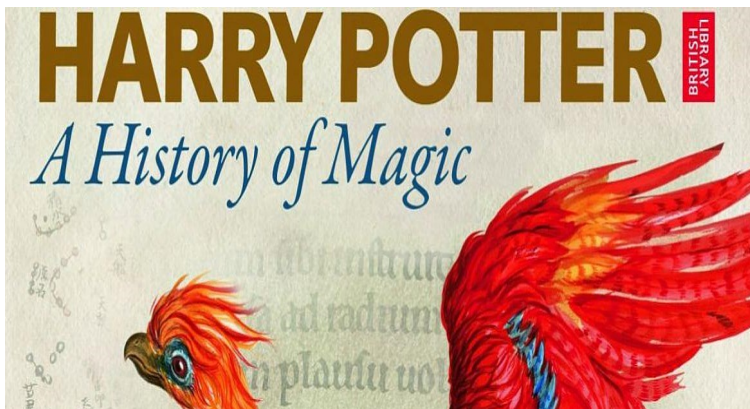

Books are not the only fruit. Does your teen read magazines? Games? Fanfiction? Cereal packets? If so, then they're reading. Build on this, don't tear it down.



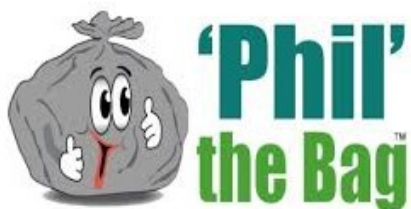

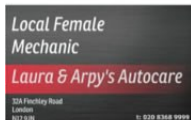
Last year we collected 880kg of textiles – let's try do it again!
