Yoga Club

This term we are introducing Yoga Classes for students twice a week on **Monday and Wednesday lunchtimes**. Classes will start on the **28th January**. There are 30 spaces available and these will be allocated on a first come first serve basis. Full details of the course are provided below and if you would like your child to attend please make the appropriate payment via Parentmail. Each session costs £6 and therefore the total cost until February half term is £36. All proceeds will go to the school. Sessions will be led by Vesna who is an experienced and passionate Yoga instructor with over 17 years of teaching. Vesna hopes to ignite a passion for yoga in her students so that it becomes a part of their everyday life and a refuge from the stresses of modern life. Vesna brings together several aspects of classical yoga: the understanding of structural alignment in the asana practice, the refinement of mental and emotional patterns through the practice of pranayama, and access to a place of stillness, relaxation and meditation. The teaching is based on applying the eight vital principals in yoga practice:

- 1. The meditation state of mind (the no –doing of the mind)
- 2. Relaxation (the not-doing the physical body)
- 3. Intent
- Rooting
- 5. Centring
- 6. Aligning
- 7. Breathing 8. Elongating


Year 9 Options Fair

Fortismere Robotics update

Following on from the success from last year, I am pleased to report with funding from the Tottenham Grammar Somerset Grant, Fortismere school is now able to field 2 new Vex EDR teams (with our own Vex EDR field) and 4 Vex IQ teams!

Last Saturday 12th January 2019 the following Fortismere Vex IQ Robotics students; Alexander Atureliya, Sarp Coskun, Mohab Helmi, Moutaz Helmi, Caleb Hyman, Aum Parmar, Sayed Hasson, Kaon Read, and Toby Yorston took part in the competition hosted at Fortismere. The event took place in South Wing Hall and was very attended by 26 teams from East Barnet School, Haberdashers' Aske's Boys' School, Henrietta Barnett School, Greig City Academy, Ilford School, Welwyn Garden City Primary and two teams from Nanjing, Jiangsu, China. There were well over 100 people in attendance.

The day was extremely eventful and at one stage Fortismere teams were top of the leader board. The standard was very high and the final scores were the highest recorded in the UK. The two teams from China, The Eagle Dad Robot Club ranked 6th in the world won the overall competition, closely followed by Henrietta Barnett School and Greig City Academy who set a new high score record for the UK. Our highest position on the day was 7th place, a good result for students in Year 7 for their first event. However, all is not lost as we will be improving our robots in light of the competition and competing in many more events.



The Fortismere Historical Fiction Reading Group


