Weekly Roundup

It was Holocaust Memorial Day on Monday and the 80th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz. As a school, we commemorated with a variety of thought-provoking and reflective events.

Years 12 and 13 attended HMD themed assemblies, giving them the space to think about what the Holocaust represents to all of us and the modern resonances. Year 9 made their annual visit to the Muswell Hill Synagogue. It is always at this time of year to coincide with HMD in order to enable students to engage more deeply with the events of the Holocaust. It was a real privilege for students to meet with a survivor and to hear his story first hand. Our students were very thoughtful on their return and clearly gained a great deal of insight from the talk.

The Drama Department took Y10 and Y11 GCSE Drama students off time table, joined by the Year 9s who didn't attend the Synagogue, for workshops and to see the performance of *Kindness: a Holocaust Legacy*. This is a powerful play based on the testimony of Susan Pollack OBE, who was sent to Auschwitz at the age of 13. Interwoven is the love story of Mala Zimetbaum and Edek Galinski, which adds further poignancy and resonance to the play. The students were totally enthralled and deeply moved; it was a very special experience for all those involved.

Next Friday, the History Department has invited Y10, 12 and 13 History students to an exceptional assembly delivered by a Holocaust survivor. We are very fortunate that most of our Y9s and a significant number of our older students will have had the opportunity to hear these accounts and we know that our students value these opportunities highly.

By way of a total contrast, the 'Pod' was launched on Thursday. The sleek silver machine will be augmenting the capacity of our canteens at break and lunch time. The students were intrigued and according to Ms Judge, the cookies sold like hot cakes! We know that given the restrictions of our site our students spend far too long queueing for food rather than having the breaks they need to unwind after lessons. The pod should help ease the queueing and make both break and lunch time a more leisurely experience for students.

When not eating, our students are philosophising. We would urge you to scroll down to the article on the inter-House Philosophy competition. The videos are a delight and explain some complex ideas with brilliant graphics. Well done to all the students who took part.

Next week is a busy one for students: we are welcoming in Y9 parents and carers on Monday for guidance meetings around option choices; on Tuesday afternoon our Year 11 and Year 13 collect their mock results and on Wednesday, it's Y11 parents' evening. They'll need a restful weekend before so much activity! We hope you all have a lovely, dry-ish weekend and we look forward to seeing many of you next week.

Holocaust Memorial Day 2025

On Wednesday we had the company **Voices of the Holocaust** come to school with their show 'Kindness'. Kindness is a verbatim play based on the testimony of survivor Susan Pollock, when she was aged only 13 and sent to the notorious Auschwitz-Birkenau in the summer of 1944.

Year 10 drama students were lucky enough to have a workshop with Cate Hollis, the founder of Voices of the Holocaust and to experiment with choreographed movement and creating atmosphere. The workshop was an incredible insight into the company's creative process and the Year 10s really made the most of it.

Later, students watched the incredible show and were visibly engaged throughout as they witnessed what life was like for Susan and the atrocities that took place. A truly important piece of theatre, Lora in Year 9 said 'it was the best acting I have ever seen'. After the show, Year 11 drama students participated in a Q&A session with Cate to discuss the creative process as well as focusing on theatrical elements such as sound, lighting, props and scenery - the session really gave them an insight into every element of putting on a show.

Creative Careers Afternoon

We were very lucky to have Jacksons Lane Theatre and three amazing creatives visit us on Thursday this week to hold an after school session all about creative careers for students in Years 9-13.

Actor, playwright, dramaturg, and events curator - Rhianna Ilube, actor - Juyddah James, and writer, director, and actor - Tatenda Shamiso shared their insights into the industry that they are a part of, their journeys into the profession, and their backgrounds. This was accompanied by showings of plays and films that they have been a part of both on stage and off. With a Q&A throughout where students, teachers, and the performers themselves asked each other poignant and reflective questions, we had the opportunity to discover what keeps the three of them creating, being a part of the world of acting, directing, and writing, their creative



processes, and their naturally emerging wisdom. It was an amazing and eye-opening afternoon, full of kind interactions, humility, professionalism, insight, inspiration, and open sharing. We'd like to leave the readers of this newsletter with some of the sentiments we were gifted:

























Careers & Work Related Learning Notice
