Everyone's Invited Website

We appreciate that our community will have found discussions around disclosure made on the Everyone's Invited website shocking and upsetting. While we know that it is vital that young people are given the space to share their experiences we also know that inevitable questions are being raised around how we protect and educate young people as well as how we support those who disclose their own experiences. What to do in the event of a positive test during the Easter Holidays

Students are required to continue to test twice a week (Sundays and Wednesdays) with the lateral flow test throughout the holidays. If a student receives a positive LFT they are to do a follow up PCR to verify the result. If the PCR is also positive please contact the NHS with the result. From Thursday 1st April to Tuesday 6th April please also inform Ms K Sullivan (Ksullivan@fortismere.org.uk) of a positive PCR test so that we can trace contacts.

Spring Term Roundup

It certainly has been the strangest of terms for everyone. It has also been very sobering to end this strange term reflecting on the incredibly upsetting stories and experiences that have been shared by young people on the Everyone's Invited website. These reflections inevitably lead us to consider what direction the conversation around sex and relationships should take with regards to education for all and support for those who need it. In our meeting this week with sixth form student leaders we listened to their thoughtfully expressed views on their experience of learning about relationships in school. This has given us some real food for thought as we think about how we should respond to the inevitable conversations that 'Everyone's Invited' provokes.

Our Relationships and Sex Education curriculum was written very recently according to updated guidelines and is robust in surfacing and tackling issues that are currently being discussed. However, in light of the impact of current discourse on our learners we will be stepping up this provision and exploring even more explicitly issues such as consent in assemblies and tutorials while contextualising more recent debate around peer on peer abuse within our delivery of PRE. We will also be reminding students of how they can access support if ever they need it.

We would encourage parents to frequently visit the safeguarding pages of our school website as we do update it with information and guidance for parents and students which can be used to support conversations at home around such issues. There is no doubt that young people are most supported when school and home collaborate to ensure they absorb messages that influence safe and respectful behaviour.

As we continue our return to some kind of normality it was great to hear the plans that Mr Orton our Director of Sport has for inspiring our students to get outside and participate in sporting activities. Mr Orton confirmed that around 100 students are staying after school pretty much every evening to play some form of sport with their peers. We were even more impressed that last wednesday around an extra 60 students from the 6th Form joined them for football trials. It's clear that our students are ready to get active which is wonderful. We are grateful to Mr Orton, Mr Hawkes and the PE department for inspiring this surge in interest in sports; it's exactly what our students need.

As term ends we would like to publicly thank our entire team of staff for their dedication to keeping learning live through the ups and downs of the past term. We'd like to thank our parents for their support and encouragement in keeping their children on track educationally.

Finally, we salute our resilient, confident and determined students who have proved they can cope with so much disruption yet still commit to their school and their learning. We hope you all have a well-deserved break.
