Weekly Roundup

We began the week with a pandemic and we're ending it with an epidemic. The new Covid guidance from the DfE gives more details for schools on 'living with Covid'. There are still some areas of confusion relating to testing and self-isolation but broadly, we are back to where we were in February two years ago. This is reflected in the type of opportunities which are once more emerging for our students. On Thursday, Y12 A' level English Literature students visited the British Library for a talk on Angela Carter. We've even had a GCSE PE rock-climbing trip. We're now looking forward to the Y12 Further Maths group going to the Science Museum, the Y13 English trip to Hamlet at The Globe and the Sixth Form Spanish trip to the BFI. Events like these immeasurably support interest and engagement and we welcome the return of these opportunities.

As we begin our return to normal, we are revisiting school systems and expectations. Covid has had a significant impact on student attendance which in turn, impacts on progress. We anticipate that the changes to self-isolation will improve attendance and we remind our families that students should not miss term time for holidays. We would also expect dental and medical appointments to be made outside of school hours wherever possible.

The news from Ukraine has been on everyone's minds this week. Our students have been asking questions and some are concerned and worried by a war starting on the continent where they live. We will be addressing these concerns via the curriculum and enabling students to discuss anything which may be causing them distress. Aside from any anxiety, Fortismere students are always very engaged with the wider world and they want to know what is going on and why. It has been brought to our attention that some of the information that students are accessing online is inaccurate or deliberately misleading. We will cover this in lessons but we would also ask our families to be mindful of the sources your sons and daughters use for information.



We hope that despite the shock and sadness at the outbreak of war in Europe, you all have a peaceful and storm-free weekend. Our thoughts are with the people of Ukraine and the members of our local community directly affected by these events.

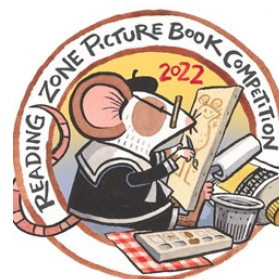
Picture Book Competition

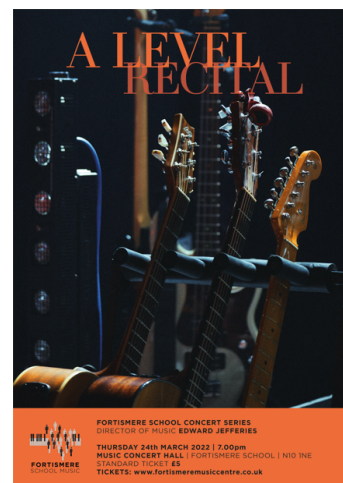

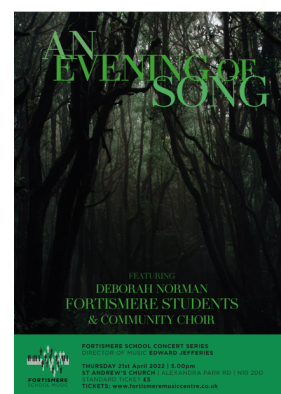

Children will learn a wide range of skills and produce their own comic strip. The course content covers:
INTRODUCTION: An overview of comics and cartoon history and their role as tools for storytelling and communication over the years.

BASIC ANATOMY: Showing how the human body works and is designed to move.

CHARACTER DESIGN: How to work up designs for different types of characters and how they fit into the stories you want to tell.

STORYTELLING: Overview of comics storytelling, layout and structure.

SCRIPTING & LETTERING: A look at the basics of comics scriptwriting and how to produce clear lettering by hand for comics.

COLOURING: An exploration of different colouring techniques (including, if possible, computer colouring).

Using the skills developed over the week, children will work on their own comic stories and by the end of the course will have produced their own complete 8-12 page comic strip.
