
A Level Recital Evening - South Wing Hall - Thursday 24th March 2022 - 7pm

Year 11 Visit to City & Islington College

On Thursday, Ms Harris and I accompanied twelve of our Year 11 students on a visit to City and Islington College. We started at the Centre for Media, Business and the Arts and then moved onto the Centre for Applied Sciences. It was interesting to see the range of impressive facilities available at the College which included photographic studios where students had photographs taken. Students particularly enjoyed the tour of the Animal Management Department, where they got some hands-on experience - see their photos below! The tour of the Forensic Science Department was a highlight especially the rooms set up to mimic real crime scenes.



The students enjoyed the day and valued the opportunities this visit gave them to find out more about the different types and levels of post 16 courses available.



Feedback from the students was that the visit had helped some of them decide on new courses, confirm they had made the right choices and for one student that this was not the right place for them. One student commented that "I enjoyed the day because it gave me hands-on experience, which gives you knowledge as to what the course is about before you start. This is true for both the animal management and the forensic science course" Another one said "The day was really good. I particularly liked the Centre for the Arts, Business and Media because it was new and spacious and offered a lot of different courses"



The visit also helps the school in meeting our Gatsby Benchmarks (a framework for good careers guidance) and I hope to arrange more of these in the future. All of the students were well behaved throughout the visit and were a real credit to Fortismere.




Royal Society Young People's Book Award 2022

"Artichoke Hearts" Drama Workshop





















