#### **Author Visit**

Our Year 10 sociology students were delighted to meet author (and doctor) Ayaan Mohamud on the publication day of her debut "You Think You Know Me". It's an exposé of the harsh realities of Islamophobia, institutional racism, bullying and gang culture in modern Britain. Compelled to write the story following the tragic deaths of Shukri Abdi, a 12-year-old Somali refugee, and Lee Rigby, a British Army soldier, Ayaan explored how the backlash from a crime committed by a Muslim affects an entire community and leads to a vicious cycle of violence. She talked about the joys of Somali culture and community, the refugee experience, gang culture, and the British media's portrayal of Muslims, including real-life examples of headlines and why we need to think beyond these. Ayaan was impressed by the maturity of our students and the sensitive and probing questions they asked. We have a few


