OFSTED Update

We are aware that there has been social media traffic in the local community speculating on both the outcome of the recent inspection and why it is not yet in the public domain. OFSTED results are embargoed until publication as the results are provisional until that stage. The leadership of the school, including the Governing Body, are therefore prohibited from disclosing any grades. The delay is not due to Fortismere registering a formal complaint: the school has been invited to participate in a more detailed fact and accuracy checking process and the report will be published once this process has concluded.
