Covid Update

Vaccination Programmes in Schools

Covid-19 vaccinations took place on site on Wednesday. The students who had consent in Years 11,10 and 7 were all vaccinated. Schools in Haringey had been guaranteed 300 vaccinations but as our consenting numbers are in excess of this, we have been given a follow up date of 10 November. All consenting Year 8 and 9 students will be vaccinated then.

There was some confusion over the electronic consent system. It would seem that some parents gave their consent before the Sunday midnight deadline (48 hours before the vaccinations) but this did not appear on the Vaccination UK list. For any parents/carers who have queries about consent, we recommend you contact <u>Vaccination UK</u>. The electronic consent will not re-open for the 10 November vaccinations but we expect to receive information on how parents and carers can organise vaccinations for their children in the community soon.

Controlling cases

We are still experiencing a steady stream of positive Covid cases. Please see below for our Covid control guidance.

- Students encouraged to wear masks in the corridors and communal areas
- Use of hand sanitiser on entry to classrooms
- Regular hand washing
- Good respiratory hygiene (tissues disposed of in a lidded bin)

Setting work for students with a positive PCR:

Students who are experiencing symptoms will not be required to complete classwork as they are unwell. Asymptomatic students will be set work via Google Classroom.

Mornings are steadily growing darker and days feeling distinctly shorter as we move towards the final week of this half term. On Wednesday of this week, Covid vaccinations took place on site. The team leading the programme, Vaccine UK informed the school that they would not have capacity to deliver all of the vaccinations for those students who had consented on the one day. They will return to administer vaccinations to Year 8 and Year 9 in November if they have already received consent. Vaccine UK have advised us that they accept no further consent forms at this point. For any students who didn't submit their consent this time but would still like to receive the vaccine there will be further information in due course as to how it can be accessed in the community. We apologise for the last minute communications on vaccinations but hope our parents and carers all appreciate that we have been reliant on receiving information from an external body which has impacted on our ability to communicate arrangements in a timely manner. We would like to thank our Welfare Officer Ms Izzet who coordinated the programme on site, supported by Ms Brown and Ms Demetriou. It was certainly a very busy day for the school and Ms Izzet and her team were complimented by the visiting medical staff on how well it had been organised. This week a number of our Year 13 students have been busy preparing UCAS applications in time for the early entry deadline which is today. Today's deadline has seen our budding medics, dentists and vets submit their applications along with any students who have decided to apply to either Oxford or Cambridge. We know that students have put a great deal of thought into their applications and the sixth form team have been incredibly impressed with the calibre of the applications. We look forward to hearing how these applications progress and wish all those who have submitted and are planning to submit their applications this month. Thanks must go to the 6th form team who have provided a great deal of guidance to support the students through this process and will continue to do so over the coming weeks as our Year 13 students explore university courses and organise their applications. Congratulations must also go this week to Stanley and Frankie Badacsonyi who have both taken part in a chess tournament (UKCC 2021) at Blenheim Palace last weekend. Stanley in 7TG came 2nd in the U12 section and Frankie in 11JN came 8th in the U18 section. Over 2000 children from over the UK entered the first stages of the tournament back in June, so they did really well to be in the final 12 in their age group for this event. We have chess club every Wednesday lunchtime in S05 where students and teachers can enjoy being thrashed by Stanley and Frankie in under five minutes.

With just one more week to go until half term we hope everyone has the opportunity to relax this weekend.

Black History Month At Fortismere

This week we would like to share some activities that have taken place as part of the work staff and students have been doing for Black History Month:

Ms T Gelagotellis – English Teacher and Year 7 Form Tutor

7TG (my form) have been celebrating BHM by creating presentations on a chosen Black hero they feel inspired by. Every student in the class has created a power point and shared with me. The students are expected to stand at the front of the class and present for 5 minutes. The students then have the opportunity to ask questions on the presentations and find out more. 6 presentations have been showcased so far on: Stormzy, Amanda Gorman, Nelson Mandela, Barack Obama,

Sheku Kanneh-Mason

Sheku Kanneh-Mason is a cellist. He passed grade 8 at age 9 and he won BBC's Young Musician of the Year contest in May 2016. Kanneh-Mason also played for Meghan Markle and Prince Harry's wedding in 2018. He has 6 siblings and they are all musicians and play with him. For example, he and his siblings performed on Britain's Got Talent in 2015. His dad is from London and his mum is from Sierra Leone.

I chose to write about Sheku Kanneh-Mason because I play the cello and he is the only black musician to have won the BBC Young Musician of the year. I think he is inspiring.

We hosted a viewing of a lecture entitled 'Black Tudors: Three Untold Stories' given by Dr Miranda Kaufmann based on her seminal book that radically changed understanding of ethnic diversity in Tudor England. Sixth form students had also researched and created presentation on influential figures from Black British History and these were exhibited before the lecture. These included fascinating presentations on Poly Styrene and Lilian Bader, who reached the rank of acting corporal as the only black woman in the Women's

Auxiliary Airforce during the Second World War. Attendance was great with over 30 students attending and we hope to host more events in the future and share the presentations across the school.

Nicole Butcher – Key Stage 3 Lead in English

This week Tuesday in English, a group of Year 9 students took part in a poetry workshop with John Osunkoya. The students, who were nominated by their teachers to take part in the workshop, focused on using rhythm and rhyme. Each student wrote their own poem birthed out of prompts provided by the workshop leader. The students' glowing feedback is a testament to the enriching and inspiring time they had. Thank you John for working with Fortismere students.

We continue next week to engage across the curriculum in all year groups with ideas and themes related to Black History Month. I would like to remind you that we will be hosting a Celebration and Exhibition Event looking at the work and activities that students have completed in honour and support of BHM on Thursday 11th November. As mentioned before we have a number of special guest speakers and specially prepared performances as well as food and drinks! It would be great to see a lot of parents there to join in our celebration.
