You will note from the change in background on the branding of this Newsletter that it is Black History Month once again. Our students will be engaging in learning opportunities across the curriculum this month giving everyone the opportunity to share, celebrate and understand the impact of black heritage and culture. There will be an opportunity to share their work with you at the end of the month but we are delighted today that the poem, 'Talk this way' by Omar Alloul in Year 12 written in response to studying the poetry of Jacob Sam-La Rose's poetry has been included in this week's Newsletter. Please do take the time to read Omar's beautifully crafted and poignant work. On the subject of poetry, we were pleased to have the opportunity to see our Poet in residence, Lewis Buxton, this week who was working with Year 8 students in their English lessons on how to create their own inspiring poems. Our students were impressive in their confidence as they read their poetry that was at times quirky and imaginative and at other thoughtful and emotive.

October 10th is World Mental Health Day. We know that post-pandemic that many young people have had significant challenges around their mental wellbeing themselves while others live with family members who have struggled. We speak regularly to our students about the mechanisms that are in place in school to support students who feel anxious or unsafe, reminding them that we have access to a range of support that can be made quickly available. Whether they choose to talk to their trusted adult or use the safe talk email (<a href="mailto:safetalk@fortismere.org.uk">safetalk@fortismere.org.uk</a>) it is vital that the young people in our community understand how important their wellbeing is to us. Please reinforce with your children the support on offer at Fortismere and let them know it's there whenever they need it, particularly if you notice them struggling with any aspect of school life.


We now have a huge pile of wonderful work to collate into a book for the library, and hope that some of our writers will want to participate in the Music and Poetry Concert in February.




