## **Award Winning Year 10 STEM Investigators**

At the end of April, a group of seventeen Year 10 students attended the annual School Science Conference at the University of Westminster. The students had been taking part in after school STEM investigation projects with Mr. Nano since January. This year's conference had the theme 'Science for the Next Generation' and highlighted the future of science and next generation technology and their significance in everyday life and health.



Our day started in the Cavendish Lecture Theatre where

student delegates were presenting their own scientific research projects and competing for The Don Henderson Award. Xavi Branford and Luke Nutt had been selected to represent Fortismere and to present their project which had explored the best light colour required for urban farming. Their presentation was excellent and they came second in the overall competition as well as gaining the CREST Bronze Award! Well done to them for a great achievement!

During the day students also participated in interactive sessions and met scientists, heard how science is applied to healthcare and answered questions to win prizes. Professor Lewis Dartnell provided a fascinating insight into astrobiology and research for microbial life on mars. It was a great day, full of interesting and inspiring science. Feedback from the students was very positive. In their words" *It was insanely fun and so interesting*". We'll be running the STEM investigation projects again next year so hopefully some current Year 9s are inspired to get involved. Well done to all the students who took part this year. Mr Nano


## CoverUp



Our gruesome little students like nothing better than a good murder, so in honour of this year's CrimeFest (the last one, sadly) we have a grisly display that includes some of these...


































# **Sport & PE Notices**
