# **Weekly Roundup**

The week began with a heat wave. Our buildings are not well suited to extremes in temperature and we had to make full use of our contingent of fans plus the room changes available due to the lack of both Y11 and Y13. For Y10s still doing their end of year exams, the Hall and Gym were two of the coolest places to be! We appreciate that for students being on the walkway in this kind of heat can be very unpleasant. They were very sensible; drinking lots of water, quite a few in hats and staying out of direct sunlight when walking between wings, were possible. The heatwave is over for now (although we do hope for good weather at the Summer Festival on Sunday!) and we hope that we have more normal temperatures until the end of term.

The improved weather also added to the enjoyment of the Y6 to Y7 transition days. It was lovely meeting the new cohort and watching them begin to accustom themselves both to the site and Fortismere's routines. Lunch time is always an interesting one for them. For some of the new students, their new year group of 270 is bigger than their entire primary school so navigating a lunch time with so many other students can feel both daunting and exciting.

The Y6s enjoyed a range of activities designed to support their confidence with regards to stepping up to secondary school and also to alleviate any worries or concerns some of the students may have. The other year groups were also excited to see the Y6s: we seem to have a high number of siblings and of course many of the current Y7 were involved with transition activities. The Y7s we spoke to were very pleased to present themselves as 'old hands' at supporting new students getting to grips with a large site and other children.

Today the Y6 parents and carers have been in school to find out some more about what to expect from Fortismere, be that support, the curriculum or how their children will be taught. Ms Judge, who will be the sole headteacher from September, also reacquainted herself with the parents and carers as well as their children. The two days have been uniformly positive, the children seem to have really enjoyed themselves and are looking forward to starting school in September. They will have the site to themselves on September 1st which will also support their transition.

At the opposite end of the spectrum from transition are the students who leave and then return. This Saturday, Fortismere is hosting a reunion of the class of 2011. A former student from that cohort has organised the reunion, inviting staff who taught the year group as well as other alumni. It is a wonderful testament to the school that former students do keep in touch and wish to celebrate their time as students with us.

Despite the cooler weather, we are very much looking forward to the Summer Festival on Sunday. The Friends of Fortismere have put together a wonderful array of different activities and we think it will be a hugely enjoyable event. See you there!





# **Extra Curricular and Community Clubs**

#### **Weaving Words Creative Writing Club**

This is a missive from Ms Massey, teacher of the Weaving Words after School Creative Writing Club. The first year of Weaving Words is drawing to a close at the end of this term. I've had three classes of ten students and their attendance and enthusiasm has remained consistent for the whole year and we've all had enormous fun! The students have told me they look forward to the weekly lessons as a way of letting their imagination flow freely from their pens and onto the page. My fine writers have said that the club has enabled them to make a new friendship group and has also helped their written academic work to flourish too. Many have told me their grades in English have shot up. The practice of writing freely is such a great way to enjoy and improve the process both creatively and academically. We write from a trigger word or a theme and create prose, poetry, dialogue and, occasionally, nonsense rhymes. The group writes collectively, sharing their individual pieces - only if they feel comfortable doing so - and receiving feedback. If you think your child would enjoy this, I will be restarting the writing club from September (after school on Monday and Tuesdays: Year 8 and above and Wednesdays: Year 7). We meet in the Library every week from 3.30pm-4.30pm. The cost is £160 pounds per term.
