Eight years ago, four Haringey school librarians got together to form the imaginatively titled Haringey Children's Book Award for students in Years 5 to 7 – the transition period between primary and secondary – with the aim for schools around the borough to form reading groups, vote on the shortlisted books and get together in a grand award ceremony. More and more schools got involved, we outgrew our award ceremony space at Heartlands School and we approached Alexandra Palace to see if they were interested in forming a partnership. The rest is history and the Alexandra Palace Children's Book Award (BiblioBuzz) is going strong, with 500+ children attending the ceremony in



the restored Victorian theatre this year. Just before half term, three of the four librarians drove to Swindon – on a school night – for a Gala Dinner as the team had been nominated for a prestigious award. Against all odds, and teams and individuals from all around the country, we won the Community Award; our certificate is now proudly displayed in the library.

This week, we four battled it out for 5 hours to choose just 6 books for APCBA 2023 from over 400 submitted by publishers in the past few months. As you can imagine, lots of reading has been done since April, and we each had our favourites; luckily the meeting remained civilised with no fisticuffs. We are now contacting authors, agents, publishers, publicists and will soon go public with what we think is a brilliant shortlist. Mrs Coles and Mrs Ward will then be inviting our Year 7s to join us on Thursday lunchtimes for reading, fun activities and biscuits – watch this space.

It was genuinely one of the best games of school football I have ever experienced in over 20 years as a teacher!
