Our students have been enjoying lots of STEM based learning activities this week. The whole of Year 7 went on a maths department trip to London Zoo where they undertook a project aimed at developing their skills as statisticians and smaller groups of scientists were lucky enough to attend either the Big Bang Science and Engineering Fair at the NEC Birmingham or the Science Jamboree which took place at the University of Cambridge. Our staff consider carefully how to bring learning and our curriculum alive and such expeditions really do give our students the opportunity to apply learning from the classroom into real world contexts. We understand that all students who attended trips this week had wonderful experiences to report on their return. We'd like to thank our Maths and Science teams for leading these 'expeditions'. Next week our Year 12 Geographers are off to the Lake District for a week of fieldwork in a stunning backdrop. We are sure they will achieve lots and wish them well

Meanwhile, in North Wing last Friday night our Art department opened their doors for their second exhibition of the summer, our A Level Art Exhibition. Yet again the standard of artwork was exceptionally high and our A level Art and Photography students' work was incredibly well received by all who attended. The art work has continued to be on display in North Wing this week so that all of our students have been able to marvel at the talent we have here at Fortismere and be inspired to create their own art.



We loved seeing our Year 11 students celebrate the end of their exams at their Prom on Wednesday. They all looked fabulous. Sixth Form Induction and Taster Days

We were delighted to welcome over 260 students to Fortismere across three successful induction and taster days this week as part of our transition programme for the incoming Year 12 cohort. Each day began with a welcome from Ms Judge (Headteacher), Ms Common (Director of Sixth Form), and Ms Bailey or Mr Kenny (Heads of Year), who shared their enthusiasm for the year ahead and outlined what students can expect from life in the Sixth Form. Students then had the opportunity to attend taster lessons in any of the 25 subjects offered at Sixth Form, as well as explore the additional qualifications we offer such as the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) and KS5 Mandarin. These sessions gave students a real flavour of Sixth Form learning and helped them start to picture what studying their chosen subjects will be like in September. Between lessons, students enjoyed socialising with their peers and tutors. On Monday, the sunny weather allowed for a picnic on the school field, while on the slightly wetter days of Tuesday or Thursday, students took the opportunity to relax and eat in the Sixth Form Café. Science Department News

Mad Scientists Visit the Big Bang Science & Engineering Fair

Last week, a group of Mad Scientists (this is the name of the Science club that takes place each Monday after school in Lab 5) visited the Big Bang Science & Engineering Fair. The trip was led by Ms Hall, who leads the Mad Scientists' Club and was supported by Mr. Commons, the Head of Physics. The event took place at the Birmingham NEC and included stands from commercial groups like; Rolls-Royce, the National Grid, Johnson & Johnson and a long list of others. As well as academic teams from universities including; Imperial College and Oxford University, there was also a wide range of environmental organisations and charities such



as the Canal & River Trust and the Wildlife Trust. All of these groups provided interesting, informative and often hands-on experiences, designed to inspire and highlight the great opportunities to be had with a STEM

career. Throughout the day there were also live demonstrations which looked at the volatile history of chemistry (which one of our students got to help out with) and also the role of biomimicry in developing new materials. Students described the experience as "brilliant" and said that "the nuclear fusion display was fascinating". We are already looking forward to next year and again taking all of our Mad Scientists on this most excellent adventure!

Science Jamboree at the University of Cambridge

The Isaac Science Group runs an annual KS3 Science Jamboree at their home in the University of Cambridge. This year Fortismere was lucky enough to get 15 places and on Wednesday this week we took a group of students that we felt could be inspired by this opportunity to the event. This was the first time any KS3 students have been given the chance to visit the brand new Roy Dolby Centre, home of the Cavendish Laboratory, the University of Cambridge's Department of Physics.

Our students got to complete experiments investigating the elastic features of strawberry laces and peach rings which was sweet (physics attempt at a joke!) and then use that data to plot graphs and analyse their findings. In the next session the Issac Science team of education experts helped them develop the calculation skills relating to weight and stretching. Students worked diligently in the very impressive lecture theatre.

As well as seeing inside exciting state-of-the-art science buildings, on the journey back, students also got to see the historic colleges. I really hope the trip will inspire some future Cambridge students. It was a great day and couldn't have taken place without the support of Ms Izzet.





Maths Department News

Year 7 Do Maths at London Zoo

On Tuesday and Wednesday this week, the Maths Department took Year 7 students on a trip to London Zoo. As part of their recent unit of work on data, the students had the opportunity to put their learning into practice in a real-world setting. Using data collection sheets that they had designed themselves, Year 7 gathered information on animal habitats, conservation status, and diet. They also timed how long penguins spent underwater and estimated the heights of various animals.



It wasn't all maths though! Students also had time to enjoy the animals and loved seeing baby gorillas, lions, tigers, spider monkeys, sloths, and much more. And as with any trip to the zoo in June, it ended with ice creams all round! Well done to Year 7 who were all great at applying their maths learning in the real world and thank you also to Mrs Chapple for organising such a memorable trip.

Year 12 Residential Field Trip 30th June to 4th July




































PRE Department News
