# **Physics Department Notice**

# Y12 Visit to The Royal Society

Year 12 physics students went to a lecture at the Royal Society this week. Udit Bhattacharjee, one of the students on the visit, has sent an excellent write up for the Newsletter.

Nine students and a teacher from the physics course went to a lecture in The Royal Society, 6-9 Carlton House Terrace, London SW1Y 5AG. The lecture was on nanotechnology by biophysicist Professor Sonia Antoranz Contera who was highly enthusiastic about matters relating to how nanotechnology was connected to physics as well as microbiology.



She talked about how physics allows you to make predictions in certain phenomena, talks about how there is a mysterious component in intuition and how those have led to major discoveries in all fields of science. She said that once you know you can predict something in time, you can use that to make something. She said that in the 21st century as physics has reached biological complexity, the world, time and space have ceased to become what they were during the time of Einstein (1905). She reveals how reality has strange consequences on time and how nanotechnology was the next major technological revolution after Einstein, as scientists began to think about what part of logic lay outside the boundaries of algorithm and intuition. All these ideas have been influenced by the ambiguity of consciousness as well as the human mind and body.

As she began to move towards biological concepts, she said that we can never separate human simplicity from the complexity of nature. She mentioned that when we let biology work by itself, we are able to create things that work through the laws of nature. Her explanation of complex structures and behavior of the human body in the nano-scale was breathtaking and fascinating. She explained how the geometry of structures play a major role in transportation as well as other chemical processes that help keep us alive.

I believe that biophysics has helped her understand the human body in a level deeper than what she would have achieved if it was simply just biology and her research has opened pathways for nanotechnology to grow and develop through years to come, such as in the field of neuromorphic computing, which is inspired by the human brain and its function and replicating it to produce computers that mimic neural networks for efficient computation.

At the end, she answered a lot of questions from the audience including topics regarding jobs, funding, future technologies as well as ethical concerns. We were fascinated by her intellect and enjoyed the lecture through and through. It has inspired me to look into nanotechnology and explore potential ideas such as its use in robotics as well as quantum computing. This July, KS3 Drama Club will be performing their own version of 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' for ONE NIGHT ONLY!


