#### **Industrial Action: Update**

#### **Parent Meeting at Parkview**

On Tuesday Parkview School hosted a parents and carers event to talk about the current dispute with the NEU around the issue of increased class sizes and teaching time. After the presentation we broke into school based groups and it was a really enjoyable session. We shared our group with Gladesmore parents (and one student!) and the questions asked were challenging and considered. One of the key issues concerned how schools are funded. It is quite complicated but the bulk of our funding comes from the DfE and is calculated on schools having 30 students in a class and teachers having 10% of their timetable with no teaching. We have been subsidising this for a number of years but with the increase in energy costs, pension contributions and exam fees, we will have to adopt this national formula.

Parents and carers are understandably concerned by the suggested increased size in tutor groups and KS3 teaching groups but the evidence from the main



provider of evidence in schools (The Education Endowment Foundation) suggests the impact is limited. You can read Reducing class size <a href="here">here</a>

#### **ACAS Meeting**

The five community secondary schools implementing the national formula met with their own NEU reps, two regional reps and a member of ACAS for talks to resolve the dispute on Wednesday. Haringey officials were also present at the meeting. It was a productive day, as headteachers we are keen to offer reductions in workload to mitigate the impact of the increased classes and greater teaching load. Unfortunately we couldn't reach complete agreement to prevent this week's strike but we are meeting again this Monday and will be working towards a mutually agreeable solution.

## Daring Dan Freedman Accepts Interview from Press Gang

Famous storywriter and Fortismere's patron of reading, Dan Freedman was interviewed by the Fortismere Press gang on the 25th of February. The members of Press gang asked him many questions ranging from "What's your favourite football team?" (he couldn't reveal) to "How do you feel about the country's way of teaching creative writing". Read on to find out more.

How do you feel about the country's way of teaching creative writing? This question got nominated as the best question by Dan himself. The question was asked by Bo Maddox (Year 7) to which Dan replied, "I think the children should have more freedom, instead of teachers telling them, Do this, Do that, they should instead change their attitude a bit and give some more leeway towards kids". This showed Dan's concern to the way schools teach creative writing (and other subjects).

Another great question asked by our fellow press gang members was **What do you think about the book industry?** To which Dan had a lot to say, "I believe the book industry is in need of a disruption, there is not a lot of communication between the author, the publisher and the audience. I also feel publishers are afraid to take risks and are publishing less and less books from aspiring authors" Dan expressed his concern for the book industry and for new authors.

In conclusion, we thoroughly enjoyed our interview with Dan Freedman and feel we have grown as journalists because of it. I feel I speak for everyone when I say, we hope something like this can happen again. Before I conclude this article I would like to thank Dan Freedman for letting us interview him.



#### **World Book Day News**


