All new Year 7s were also given a copy of our transition book, Wrath by Marcus Sedgewick, when they visited the Library. The Librarians had put together a 'goody bag' with book marks and reading lists. We hope everyone reads this book over the summer. It's a Barrington Stoke novel, printed in a dyslexia-friendly font. Sad at times but ultimately uplifting it's about change and new beginnings so hopefully something every new student can identify with. On Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon everyone was treated to Year 10 drama performances and a music concert involving choir, big band and many more of our talented students. We also had an enthusiastic response to our school lunches and the north wing canteen staff rose to the occasion and served nearly 270 additional children! Black and Black Heritage (BBH) at Fortismere

Year 9 Mentoring Programme

My name is Sarah Aina and I am part of the Year 9 mentoring programme run at Fortismere by *With Insight*. It is aimed at empowering Black heritage students to successfully apply to top universities as a gateway to a more prosperous future. Having a mentor to discuss all the questions that you have about A levels and university has been amazing and a wonderful experience; I definitely feel more confident and prepared about my academic choices. During the programme, we have considered whether university is the right route and what challenges we would face if we did go to university, and also how we



would benefit. We talked with our mentor about which university could be right, also discussing which course we would like to do and why. After a few weeks of mentoring sessions, we had the opportunity to visit the university where our mentors are studying (SOAS University of London) and we got to meet our mentors. We were able to ask them face-to-face, everything about university life and all the questions we had. There was also another school there, Hornsey School for Girls, who we had a chance to get to know as well. Our mentors discussed student accommodation, courses offered at SOAS, the languages taught, lectures, making friends and finding yourself. After our talks with our mentors, we split into two groups and they led us on a tour of the university. We visited the public gallery, some enormous lecture rooms, places where students relax and study, and even the four storey library! After our tour, we returned to the main building and had a presentation from all our mentors which explained tuition fees, student loans, being proactive, studying and travelling abroad and seeking help from our teachers. We then had a graduation ceremony from the mentoring program, and received certificates and a goodie bag! We all learnt so much from our mentors and we hope to go on another trip like it very soon!


Geography Department




