### COVID: Student home testing arrangements

We would ask that parents spend some time this weekend going over the details of this with their child including watching the self-testing video in advance so they know what to expect. Please click the link [here](#) for the video.

### What to do in the event of a positive lateral flow test

If a student receives a positive reading using the lateral flow home test they need to confirm the result with a PCR test. Students should contact Fortismere ([Ksullivan@fortismere.org.uk](mailto:Ksullivan@fortismere.org.uk)) to let us know the result of the lateral flow test and then the result of the PCR. Students are required to self isolate while waiting for the PCR result. If the PCR result is negative, the student can stop self-isolating and return to school. If the result is also positive, we will need a list of contacts and the student will need to self-isolate for 10 days. Further detailed information is available on our [COVID webpages](#).

### Masks in lessons: Update

Students have adapted well to wearing face coverings in lessons. However, wearing masks for a prolonged period of time can lead to discomfort. PH Haringey has advised us that students will benefit from bringing two masks into school and changing their mask during the day. If possible, therefore, could parents/carers send students to school with two masks. The government is reviewing this recommendation on April 12.

### GCSE and A Level arrangements

Ofqual released its guidance on awarding grades for GCSEs and A Levels at the end of last month. This guidance is important and gives us some principles to work to but does not contain all of the subject specific details we need. Ofqual have directed the exam boards to provide us with this no later than 23<sup>rd</sup> March. Please expect an update next week.

The final grades for students will be arrived at from a range of evidence that will vary from subject to subject and could include prior work, Non-Examined Assessments (coursework) and future assignments. The week before we break up for the Easter holidays we aim to share with you the evidence that each department will use to arrive at the grade. In this communication we will also aim to inform you of the timing of any assignments that the departments have planned in order to gather evidence for the grade as well as the topic areas.

### Weekly Roundup

Our COVID testing centres closed their doors this Tuesday which we have viewed as an early step towards Fortismere feeling more like our school again. As always, our students have got back into the swing of things very quickly and we are nothing short of impressed by their positivity and adaptability. It's clear that the frustrations of learning in bubbles and being based in the same classrooms for much of their learning time is starting to wear a bit thin but we know that our students are resilient and optimistic young people who will continue to work within the COVID guidelines. The transition to learning in the classroom has been remarkably smooth given the return to face-to-face learning occurred mid-term with students sharing work that has been truly inspirational. English teachers have shared some incredibly moving, powerful and brilliantly reflective rhetorical speeches that were prepared by Year 9 students during lockdown covering topics from political corruption, body image in the media and creativity in the education system. Well done Year 9! We hope we are able to share some of this work more publicly in due course.

This week we were delighted to have been invited by Ms Ward, our librarian to read extracts from two of the novels that have been selected to be part of the Alexandra Palace Book award which are being judged by an eager group of Year 7 readers. Ms Ward and her team are so committed to developing exciting reading opportunities for our students (and their parents) through a variety of book groups detailed later in this week's Newsletter. We would highly recommend that all of our students find that silver lining to the frustrations of current social restrictions to escape reality through the pages of a novel. We can't do much right now but we can certainly enrich ourselves through literature and the benefits of this on our wellbeing should never be under-estimated.

We hope you all have the opportunity to relax and perhaps curl up with a book too this weekend.

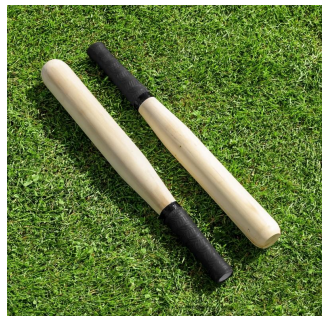

You may remember our 'Santa Run' just before Christmas. Well, the department is delighted to announce that we will be running an Easter 3K event – look out next week for full details.

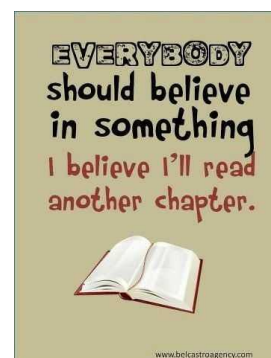


## Library

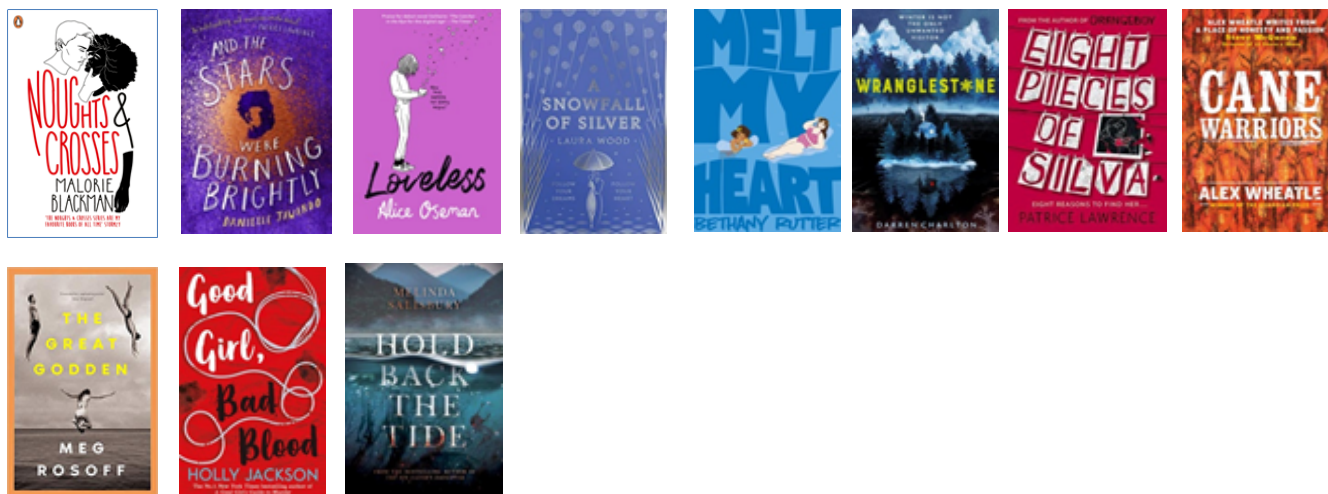
We will have a Year 8 group shadowing the award, starting next Tuesday – 8 books to get through in 14 weeks. We'll keep you posted with links to our special webpage.
