### **Weekly Roundup**

This week we have been reviewing our 'Student Voice' opportunities and are impressed by the range of groups and roles that enable our students to be heard. The Pastoral Team has introduced a system of Form Representatives who have opted into different student voice groups: Safeguarding, Diversity, Climate Change and Sustainability and Olive Branch award. These are 'voted for' positions currently for year 7-10.

Each group has a different remit; the Safeguarding group meets to discuss issues around safety and communications with the Safeguarding Team and feeds into our strategies. The Diversity Group ensures equal representation and curriculum content while the Climate and Sustainability Group work with Ms Holder on improvements we can make with regards to net zero, recycling and site maintenance. The Olive Branch Group is working with 'Solutions not Sides' which follows up from the Stand Up! Workshops in the first term, countering misinformation and ensuring that any external conflicts are not replicated in school. This also includes students reporting back on any racist (including anti-Semitic) graffiti and working with us on our classroom and pastoral approaches. The Olive Branch Group met today and we are looking forward to their report back.

Year 12 has also introduced a Form representative system and there are three sixth formers supporting each of the groups. The lower school loves working with Sixth Formers and they provide a useful role model for our younger students.

Not all student voice is conducted via groups. This week's Newsletter has the student magazine, Fortistory, attached. If you want a real insight into the issues and events concerning our students, please take a look. We are very proud of the work down by our very own press gang!

We are pleased to be able to give Year 10 students an opportunity to meet and engage with local Award winning Filmmaker Amani Simpson on Monday 29th April here at Fortismere school. Amani was brought up in Tottenham and has developed an inspiring career for himself as a Short Film maker and Public Speaker where he focuses on what it is like to grow up in North London. His films are insightful and thought provoking and a helpful contribution to our PRE curriculum for our students. We expect our students to be both engaged and challenged by the workshops and we anticipate much enthusiasm from the year group about the experience.

Students have been complaining all week about the unseasonal cold and we've had to explain that although we control many things, it does not include the weather! We are expecting warmer weather next week but in the meantime, we would urge parents to follow the Old English advice: "n'er cast a clout till May is out".
