<ul> <li>A positive lateral flow test means a minimum self isolation of 7 days. Anyone who tests positive will be able to leave self-isolation 7 days after the date of their initial positive test if they receive 2 negative LFD results, 24 hours apart, on days 6 and 7.</li> <li>All staff and secondary aged pupils and students should have access to a box of 7 LFD tests from their education setting. aged children LFD test kits are available through the usual routes (community test sites, local pharmacies or online).</li> </ul>	10/1/22- 21/1/22	Y13 Mock Exams

- Anyone over the age of 18 years and 6 months who is not vaccinated, must isolate in line with government guidelines if they are a close contact of a positive case.			
<ul> <li>It is important to continue regular twice weekly, at-home testing for all students of secondary age and above.</li> </ul>			
Very close contacts			
Students (from reception age or above) who live with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, should take an <u>LFD test</u> <u>every day for 7 days</u> : testing should start from when the first person in the home tests positive as household transmission is very likely to happen. If at any time the student becomes symptomatic, they must stay at home and arrange for a PCR test immediately (regardless of having already had a negative PCR test result).

#### Weekly Roundup

Welcome to the first Newsletter of the new term. We hope that all our families managed a peaceful and relaxing break and we look forward to the lengthening days and warmer weather (although it was an unusually mild holiday!). As we are all aware, the Omicron variant made its presence felt in London during the holiday and schools have been directed to re-implement mask wearing in classrooms. We are aware that some students are exempt and those that do not already have cards attached to their lanyards will be identified by their tutors for access to a card. We would remind parents and carers that exemption is for an underlying medical condition, not as an ideological statement. We are guided by the DfE and will enforce guidance designed to keep our community safe.



In addition to masking, there is new guidance on self-isolation which is above in the Covid update. It appears to be a rapidly changing landscape with regards to testing and self-isolation and we will keep our families informed of any changes which come to us via the DfE or Public Health Haringey.

We would like to say thank you to our families for your support during the testing process at the start of term. This caused minimal disruption to learning and by Wednesday breaktime all our students were where they need to be: in classes and learning.

So far, the Government's 'Plan B' has not placed restrictions on our curriculum and we are looking forward to a term packed with our usual activities; from sporting success to music for the masses, we anticipate there being opportunities for everyone this term. There is also an emphasis on Year 9 around the Options process. Please could the parents and carers of Y9 students keep a close eye on the calendar for the upcoming events designed to give Year 9 students maximum support and information for this process.

The Co-Heads will also resume or 'Co-Headteachers' Surgeries' this term. These are an opportunity for parents and carers to raise issues to do with policies of practice rather than individual students (this is best discussed with a tutor or head of year). We will publish the dates and times in next week's Newsletter and provide a link to the pro-forma for the surgeries.

We wish you all a happy and not too damp weekend and look forward to seeing many of you this term.

#### Absences from Mocks due to Covid

If you are absent from your mock exams due to Covid we request that you provide us with evidence which we will then be able to use in the event of the cancellation of the formal exams. The evidence should take the form of either:

- 1. NHS confirmation of a positive Lateral Flow Test must include name and date
- 2. NHS confirmation of a positive PCR Test must include name and date
- 3. Contact from NHS Track and Trace requesting that you isolate must include name and date.

This evidence should be emailed to your Head of Year and our Exams Officer (Ruth Robson).

#### Year 9 Options

The New Year marks a very exciting chapter for our Year 9's during which they will begin the process of choosing their options for Key Stage 4. As part of this process tutor time will be dedicated to learning more about the subjects available and a greater detail about each course, the content and the assessment framework. Students will be given help, support and guidance along the way to ensure that the choices they make are right for them and give them the qualifications they need for future employment / study. Students and parents will be offered a Deep Learning



Conversation (guidance meeting) with a member of staff on the 26th January, this will give an opportunity for them to ask questions and gain a greater understanding of how it works.

Alongside this on Friday 21st January the usual year 9 timetable will be collapsed and students will spend the day being given detailed information about this process, will have access to our career software Kudos and will complete workshops aimed at supporting positive choices for their futures. We will also be hosting external speakers, alumni and professionals who will speak about their careers, choices they made and how their education impacted on their career. Parents and carers will receive more information about this in the coming weeks.
