If at any time the student becomes symptomatic, they must stay at home and arrange for a PCR test immediately (regardless of having already had a negative PCR test result). #### **Weekly Roundup**

This week saw a return to events that have been put on hold during the pandemic. Every year we participate in the Jack Petchey Speakers Trust Speak Out Challenge but last year this was a casualty of Covid. This was particularly disheartening as we had a student representing Fortismere in the national finals. Last wednesday Ms WIlliams started this year's process with a selected group of Year 10. Fortismere students are very talented at speaking out and we look forward to hearing their speeches later this year.

Today, the Music Department has invited Tadashi Imai to host piano masterclasses for music students. Tadashi is a piano teacher at the Junior Royal Academy and the Queen Elizabeth's School and is a resident piano accompanist for the Academy. The students (and the audience) are extremely fortunate to have this opportunity.

On a less cultural note, we had our half termly fire drill this week for the whole of Fortismere. We have a complex set of buildings covering a large site and the students' response to the drill was really positive. We could do with more silence on leaving the buildings but they were exemplary during the lining up outside. Given the difficulties of our site, this is a key area of health and safety for us and the mature attitude of the students reassures us that they understand the importance.

The next three weeks see a traditional Fortismere approach to Christmas: a drama production, the music concert and 2 parents evenings! We strongly recommend both Dr Jekyll and Hyde and the Christmas Music Concert. Both Co-Heads have been audience members for immersive theatre before at Fortismere (A level students in a production of 'Rear WIndow') and it is an extraordinary experience. We are also looking forward to the Music Concert enormously: the GCSE rehearsals were amazing and we know that the quality of music goes from strength to strength, and it began already at a high point. We also see a return to the Christmas Craft Fair (12/12/21) which manages to be both a lovely community event and an important fundraising event for us. We hope to see many of our parents and carers at all our events.

We'll be wrapping up warm and staying indoors to avoid Storm Arwen. We wish you all a peaceful and cosy weekend.


#### **Postage Stamps**




