Update to Fortismere Parents on Change for 2025/26

Parents will shortly be receiving a letter via email from the CoHeadteachers outlining the finalised plans for the school day timings from September 2025 and confirmed dates for the two week October Half term 2025.

We'd like to thank those who took the time to complete our feedback survey over the half term. We found your comments incredibly useful and there were questions raised around how we intend to manage break and lunchtimes, the impact on pastoral support time that these changes may have and some queries on how teachers will manage the delivery of learning in larger groups. We will address frequently raised points in our longer communication.

In terms of significant changes two key points to note are as follows:

1. There will be a 2 week half term for students in Years 7-10, and Year 12 in October 2025

The dates for the October half term 2025 are from Monday 27th October - Friday 7th November. Year 11 and Year 13 Mock exams will commence in school from Thursday 6th November. School will be open for Year 11 and Year 13 students only on Thursday 6th and Friday 7th November. We will review this arrangement with parents at the end of the autumn term in order to inform October half term arrangements for subsequent years.

2. Most lessons in KS3 will be taught in groups of 30 students

This means that Key Stage 3 tutor groups (Years 7-9) will be reorganised from groups of 27 to groups of 30. The current Year 9 tutor groups will also be re-organised for Year 10 as those students move to their new tutors in North Wing. A letter from Ms Brooks, Assistant Head (KS3 Pastoral and Inclusion) which explains how this is being arranged will be sent to parents of Key Stage 3 students early next week.



Welcome to Y6 parents! As you can see from the Newsletter, Fortismere tends to be a very busy place. A great way to get to know the school (in addition to reading the Newsletter!) is to come to our Summer Festival. 

Can You Support Former Student Frankie Reach Her Target

Hello, I'm Frankie and I was a Fortismere student from 2016 to 2023 and I'm now studying at the University of Leeds. This August, I'm taking on a huge challenge and climbing the tallest freestanding mountain in the world – Mount Kilimanjaro – to raise money for a charity called Student Minds.



Mental health is something I've personally struggled with, and it's impacted people close to me - especially during school and university. Even when you're surrounded by a supportive community, I know it can be incredibly hard to know who to turn to or how to ask for help. That's why I'm so passionate about what Student Minds is doing - changing the way mental health is supported in education across the country and making sure students aren't left to struggle alone.

Our team is aiming to raise over £50,000 for this amazing, Leeds-founded charity. I recently ran the Leeds Half Marathon as part of my training and fundraising and now I'm getting ready to take on Mount Kilimanjaro in a few weeks! Fortismere played such a huge part in shaping who I am. Being part of the school sports teams helped build the strength, resilience and confidence I'm now using to take on this challenge.
